G.S.R. 1903.—In exercise of the powers conferred by the proviso to article 309 of the Constitution, the President hereby makes the following rules to amend the Ministry of Law, Legislative Department Class II post—(Law Journals) Recruitment Rules, 1968, namely:—

1. (1) These rules may be called the Ministry of Law, Legislative Department Class II post—(Law Journals) Amendment Rules, 1968.
- (2) They shall come into force on the date of their publication in the Official Gazette.

MINISTRY OF INFORMATION AND BROADCASTING

G.S.R. 1905.—In exercise of the powers conferred by the proviso to article 309 of the Constitution, the President hereby makes the following rules further to amend the All India Radio (Class I Posts) Recruitment Rules, 1963, published with the notification of the Government of India in the Ministry of Information & Broadcasting, No. G.S.R. 24, dated the 23rd December, 1963, namely:—

1. (1) These rules may be called the All India Radio (Class I posts) Recruitment (Third Amendment) Rules, 1968.

(2) They shall come into force on the date of their publication in the official gazette.

2. In the All India Radio (Class I posts) Recruitment Rules, 1963, in the Schedule, in column 12 against Serial No. 7, for the existing entry, the following entry shall be substituted, namely:—

“Transfer on deputation of an officer of the Central/State Government holding analogous post and possessing—

- (i) a degree in agriculture/agriculture extension; and
- (ii) about five years' experience in the field of farm information and communication, especially in intensive cultivation schemes of Central Government/ State Governments.

(Period of deputation—ordinarily not exceeding 4 years).”

G.S.R. 1906.—In exercise of the powers conferred by the proviso to article 309 of the Constitution, the President hereby makes the following rules further to amend the All India Radio (Class III posts) Recruitment Rules, 1964, published with the notification of the Government of India in the Ministry of Information and Broadcasting No. G.S.R. 1776, dated the 30th November, 1964, namely:

1. (1) These rules may be called the All India Radio (Class III posts) Recruitment (ninth amendment) Rules, 1968.

(2) They shall come into force on the date of their publication in the Official Gazette.

2. In the Schedule to the All India Radio (Class III posts) Recruitment Rules, 1964, against Serial No. 35, relating to the post of Engineering Assistant,

- (i) in column 5, after the existing entry, the following entries shall be added, namely:—

“Foot Note:

A common seniority list will be maintained for Engineering Assistants working in All India Radio Stations and Offices located in a group of States comprising a Region as indicated below and transfers shall be made within the respective Regions on the basis of the said list:—

Eastern Region.—Assam, NEFA, Orissa, West Bengal, Bihar, Manipur, (Union territory), Nagaland and Tripura (Union territory).

Northern Region.—Jammu and Kashmir, Punjab, Haryana, Uttar Pradesh, Himachal Pradesh (Union territory), Chandigarh (Union territory), Delhi (Union territory) and Rajasthan.

Western Region.—Maharashtra, Gujarat, Madhya Pradesh, Goa, Daman and Diu.

Southern Region.—Madras, Andhra Pradesh, Mysore, Kerala, Lacadives, Minicoy and Amindive Islands, Andaman and Nicobar Islands and Pondicherry (Union territory)”.

- (ii) in column 11, after the existing entry, the following entries shall be added, namely:—

“Foot Note:

The new recruits will be given an initial in-service training and will have to pass a departmental test before the completion of their probation
