G.S.R. 1777.—In exercise of the powers conferred by the proviso to article 309 of the Constitution, the President hereby makes the following rules, namely:—

1. **Short title.**—These rules may be called the All India Radio (Class IV posts) Recruitment Rules, 1964.

2. **Application.**—These rules shall apply to the posts specified in column 2 of the Schedule annexed hereto.

3. **Classification, scale of pay, method of recruitment, age limit etc.**—The classification of the said posts, the scales of pay attached thereto, the method of recruitment, age limit and other matters connected therewith shall be as specified in columns 3 to 13 of the said Schedule:

Provided that:

(1) the upper age limit specified in column 9 of the said Schedule may be relaxed in the case of candidates belonging to the Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes and other special categories of persons in accordance with the general orders issued from time to time by the Central Government;

(2) the posts required to be filled by promotion may be filled by direct recruitment, if no suitable candidate is available for appointment thereto by promotion.

4. Notwithstanding anything contained in these rules, out of the total number of permanent vacancies in each of the class IV posts specified in the Schedule to be filled by direct recruitment, not more than one third may be filled by transfer from among the employees of the State Governments in accordance with the general instructions issued by the Central Government from time to time.

Note.—For this purpose, there should be a minimum of three permanent vacancies to be filled by direct recruitment during a particular calendar year.

5. **Disqualification.**—(a) No person who has more than one wife living or who having a spouse living, marries in any case in which such marriage is void by reason of its taking place during the life time of such spouse, shall be eligible for appointment to any of the said posts; and

(b) no woman whose marriage is void by reason of the husband having a wife living at the time of such marriage or who has married a person who has a wife living at the time of such marriage shall be eligible for appointment to any of the said posts;

Provided that the Central Government may, if satisfied that there are special grounds for so ordering, exempt any person from the operation of this rule.

6. **Power to relax.**—Where the Central Government is of the opinion that it is necessary or expedient so to do, it may, by order, for reasons to be recorded in writing, relax any of the provisions of these rules with respect to any class or category of persons.
