G.S.R. 1822A.—In exercise of the powers conferred by the proviso to article 309 of the Constitution, the President hereby makes the following rules further to amend the All India Radio (Class I Posts) Recruitment Rules, 1963, published with the notification of the Government of India in the Ministry of Information and Broadcasting No. GSR 24 dated the 23rd December, 1963, namely:—

1. These rules may be called the All India Radio (Class I Posts) Recruitment (Third Amendment) Rules, 1965.

2. In the All India Radio (Class I Posts) Recruitment Rules, 1963, in the Schedule in column 12 against Serial No. 2, for the existing entry, the following entry shall be substituted, namely:—

"Promotion:

Programme Executives (both Selection Grade and Ordinary Grade) with at least five years' approved service in either of, or both, the Grades."

MINISTRY OF LABOUR AND EMPLOYMENT

G.S.R. 1821.—In exercise of the powers conferred by the proviso to article 309 of the Constitution and in supersession of the notification of the Government of India in the Ministry of Labour and Employment No. G.S.R. 1308, dated the 19th November, 1959, the President hereby makes the following rules regulating the recruitment to Class I and Class II posts in the Office of the Chief Inspector of Mines, namely:—

1. **Short title.**—These rules may be called the Office of the Chief Inspector of Mines (Class I and Class II Posts) Recruitment Rules, 1965.

2. **Application.**—These rules shall apply for recruitment to the posts specified in column 2 of the Schedule annexed hereto.

3. **Number, classification and scale of pay.**—The number of posts, their classification and the scales of pay attached thereto shall be as specified in columns 3 to 5 of the said Schedule.

4. **Method of recruitment, age limit and other qualifications.**—The method of recruitment, age limit, qualifications and other matters connected therewith shall be as specified in columns 6 to 13 of the Schedule aforesaid:

Provided that the upper age limit prescribed for direct recruitment may be relaxed in the case of Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes and other categories of persons in accordance with the orders issued from time to time by the Central Government.

5. **Liability to serve in Defence services.**—Any person appointed to the posts mentioned at serial numbers 1 to 9 of the Schedule aforesaid shall, if so required, be liable to serve in any Defence Service or post connected with the Defence of India for a period of not less than four years including the period spent on training, if any:

Provided that such person,—

- (a) shall not be required to serve as aforesaid after the expiry of ten years from the date of appointment;
- (b) shall not ordinarily be required to serve as aforesaid after attaining the age of forty years.
