**(Department of Mines and Metals)***New Delhi, the 3rd January 1966*

**G.S.R. 57.**—In exercise of the powers conferred by section 17 of the Coal Mines (Conservation and Safety) Act, 1952 (XII of 1952), the Central Government hereby makes the following rules further to amend the Coal Mines (Conservation and Safety) Rules, 1954, the same having been previously published as required by sub-section (1) of the said section, namely:—

**RULES**

1. (i) These rules may be called the Coal Mines (Conservation and Safety) Second Amendment Rules, 1966.

(ii) They shall come into force on the date of their publication in the Official Gazette.

2. In the Coal Mines (Conservation and Safety) Rules, 1954, in rule 58, for sub-rule (5), the following sub-rule shall be substituted, namely:—

“(5) The cheques referred to in sub-rule (4) and all orders for the making of deposits or investments or for the withdrawal of such deposits or the realisation of such investments or for the disposal in any other manner of the funds of the Board shall be drawn or made under the signature or signatures of the undermentioned authorities, namely:—

- (a) where the amount does not exceed Rs. 1,000 (Rupees one thousand) an officer duly authorised by the Board in this behalf;
- (b) where the amount exceeds Rs. 1,000 (Rupees one thousand) but does not exceed Rs. 5,000 (Rupees five thousands), the Financial Adviser and Chief Accounts Officer of the Board, or, in his absence, the Secretary to the Board;
- (c) where the amount exceeds Rs. 5,000 (Rupees five thousands) but does not exceed Rs. 25,000 (Rupees twentyfive thousands), the Financial Adviser and Chief Accounts Officer of the Board and the Secretary to the Board, or in the absence of either of them, the Financial Adviser and Chief Accounts Officer or as the case may be, the secretary to the Board and an officer duly authorised by the Board in this behalf;
- (d) where the amount exceeds Rs. 25,000 (Rupees twenty-five thousands) the Financial Adviser and Chief Accounts Officer of the Board and the Chairman of the Board or in the absence of the Financial Adviser and Chief Accounts Officer of the Board, the Secretary to the Board and the Chairman of the Board.
