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CHAPTER I

PRASAR BHARATI – AN OVERVIEW

A. INTRODUCTION:

Prasar Bharati, India's Public Service Broadcaster, was established under the Prasar Bharati Act, 1990, and came into existence on 23rd November 1997. Its mandate is to organize and conduct public broadcasting services in the country -- to inform, educate and entertain, and to ensure balanced development of broadcasting on radio and television. Over the years it has worked tirelessly to fulfil its statutory mandate as enshrined in the Prasar Bharati Act.

Akashvani (All India Radio – the Radio network) and Doordarshan (the Television network) are its constituents. Prasar Bharati also operates DD FreeDish, the only free Direct to Home service which is the largest distributed DTH platform in India. Prasar Bharati extends its reach through digital platforms, operates the NewsOnAir App as well as Prasar Bharati News Service (digital news service) in tandem with its nationwide multilingual broadcast services over Doordarshan and All India Radio.

Doordarshan and All India Radio have played a catalytic role in the development of the nation. The contributions made by radio and television in almost every sphere -- agriculture, industrial growth, education, health care, immunization, emancipation of women, strengthening of grassroots governance and democratization process -- are well recognized. The broadcast networks safeguard citizens' rights to be informed freely and objectively on matters of public interest, national and international, and facilitate a fair and balanced flow of information including divergent views without promoting any ideology. The organization strives to uphold the unity and integrity of the country and the values enshrined in the Constitution.

Focussed attention is given to cultural diversity and languages, rural development, environment, food and agriculture, health & family welfare, education, sports, and science & technology. Programmes for special needs of the youth, empowerment of women, social justice, welfare of working classes, minorities and tribal communities, protecting the interest of children and vulnerable sections of society, are broadcast. Content is also live streamed and can be accessed anywhere through the mobile app NewsOnAir.

Prasar Bharati Channels occupy a position of credibility and trust in a highly commercialized electronic media environment in the country. Ethical norms and guidelines framed by Prasar Bharati provide a bench-mark for the industry.

B. OBJECTIVES:

The following are major objectives of Prasar Bharati set out in the Prasar Bharati Act, 1990:

- i) To uphold the unity, integrity of the country and the values enshrined in the Constitution.
- ii) To promote national integration.
- iii) To safeguard the citizen's right to be informed on all matters of public interest and presenting a fair and balanced flow of information.
- iv) To pay special attention to the fields of education and spread of literacy, agriculture, rural development, environment, health & family welfare and science & technology.
- v) To create the awareness about women's issues and to take special steps to protect the interests of the children, the aged and other vulnerable sections of the society.
- vi) To provide adequate coverage to the diverse cultures, sports & games and the youth affairs.
- vii) To promote social justice, safeguarding the rights of working classes, minorities and tribal communities.
- viii) To promote research and expand the broadcasting facilities and development in the broadcasting technologies.

C. THE PRASAR BHARATI BOARD

Prasar Bharati is governed by the Prasar Bharati Board. The Board is headed by a Chairman and has three whole time Members- the Executive Member (Chief Executive Officer), Member (Finance) and Member (Personnel). The Board has six part-time Members, a representative of the Ministry of Information & Broadcasting and the Director Generals of All India Radio and Doordarshan as ex-officio Members.

The tenure of Chairman is three years subject to the maximum age limit of 70 years, whichever is earlier. The Executive Member has tenure of five years, subject to an age-limit of sixty five years, whichever is earlier. The Member (Finance) and the Member (Personnel) are whole-time Members with six year tenure, subject to the age limit of 62 years, whichever is earlier. The Prasar Bharati Board normally meets at least six times in a year.

MEETINGS OF THE PRASAR BHARATI BOARD

During the year, 6 meetings of Prasar Bharati Board (167th to 172nd) and 18 meetings of Board Committees were held. Some important decisions taken and key matters deliberated upon during these meetings are as under:

D. THE ORGANISATIONAL SETUP

The Prasar Bharati Board functions at the apex level ensuring general superintendence, direction and management of the affairs of the Corporation. The Board is assisted by a Secretariat consisting of officers from Programme, Technical, Finance and Administration.

The Executive Member is the Chief Executive Officer (CEO) of Prasar Bharati. Officers from different streams in the Prasar Bharati Secretariat assist the CEO, Member (Finance) and Member (Personnel) in overseeing operations, implementation of plans and policies, as well as management of budget, accounts and financial matters.

The All India Radio (AIR) and the Doordarshan (DD) Directorates are headed by respective Directors General (DGs). The News Wing of All India Radio is headed by Director General, News Services Division (NSD) and that of Doordarshan by Director General, News and Current Affairs (N&CA).

The DGs are assisted by Additional Directors General (ADGs) in Programme, Administration and Finance Wings, and an Engineer-in-Chief in the Engineering Wing.

The Directorates are responsible for policy formulation, planning and development, infrastructure and technology upgradation, budgetary planning and control, human resource management, overseeing operations and maintenance activities, etc.

Field level Operations and Management are executed through the zonal offices in the North Zone (Delhi), South Zone (Chennai), East Zone (Kolkata), West Zone (Mumbai) and North East Zone (Guwahati). ADG level officers function as Zonal Heads for Content Operations, Broadcast Operations and Administration. A National Zone supervises the channels of Doordarshan and All India Radio.

Prasar Bharati has a Vigilance set-up at the headquarters headed by a Chief Vigilance Officer.

Commercial Sales and Billing of All India Radio is handled by the Central Sales Unit (CSU) at Mumbai along with 15 main Commercial Broadcasting Service (CBS) Centers (renamed Sales Centres- SCs) across the Country. The Commercial Revenue Division (CRD) (renamed Public Outreach Service -POS) in Delhi manages Government business. Corporate Sales in Doordarshan are handled by Commercial Revenue Divisions (CRDs) (renamed Sales Divisions-SDs) located in Mumbai, New Delhi, Kolkata and Bengaluru. Centralised Billing is done by the Doordarshan Commercial Service (DCS) in Delhi.

The National Academy of Broadcasting & Multimedia (NABM) with its main campus at Kingsway Camp, Delhi is Prasar Bharati's training facility. It has regional campuses at Bhubaneswar and Shillong. The Academy's Programme Division is responsible for in-service training of Programme and Administrative personnel. The Technical Division organizes Training Courses for the engineering staff. The NABM also conducts departmental promotion examinations for staff including examination for recruitment in various cadres. International Collaboration to be added here.

The Archives, Research Department, Civil Construction Wing (CCW) and AIR Resources are common facilities for AIR and Doordarshan.

The PB Recruitment Board (PBRB) created on 12.02.2020, handles recruitment of personnel below the level of Joint Secretary to the Govt. of India.

E. REFORMS AND STRATEGIES:

1. Digital Platforms:

(a) Major Milestones of PBNS, Outcomes & Achievement

- iii) COVID Management: Digital amplification of TV and Radio Programs on awareness and disinformation combat during COVID Pandemic, Social Media campaign of "Stay Home Stay Safe", and extensive, timely coverage on Social Media Platforms.
- iv) Network-wide platform NDMS, a powerful tool for news gathering launched.
- v) For Content Syndication, International content distribution through AVM, etc., and distribution of hearing-impaired video-based content to Private media through FTP started.
- vi) Renewed NewsOnAIR Website and App launched.
- vii) PBNS Telegram gets launched for providing free content to media - Today An Eye On, Sign language bulletin, Media scan, Hindi & English articles, Hindi & English videos, Fake News Busting, Magazine, Graphics (Eg - Corona Jagrukta series).
- viii) PBNS Twitter handle hits 150k followers on 22nd Feb 2022, had hit 100k followers on 13th July 2021 and 50k on 25th July 2020.

(b) Building the Global Digital Arm of the Public Service Broadcaster of India

Creating the blueprint for Digital Presence of Prasar Bharati. Identifying Space, Coordinating Infrastructure, Hiring Manpower and commissioning the one of its kind Digital News Agency Service for Ministry of Information & Broadcasting under the aegis of Prasar Bharati.

(c) News Agency Services

- Engagement of News Service ANI and content distribution to all the three verticals, namely AIR, DD and Digital
- Facilitating Services of Foreign News Agencies for Prasar Bharati Network
- Engagement of Multilingual News Service for AIR, DD & PBNS.
- Developing PBNS as the Digital Media agency for the National Broadcaster with launch of information as short text, Long text, Videos Standard HDE & a special initiative for Vertical Videos most suitable on Hand held devices.
- Fake News Busting through the Social Media Platforms by corroborating, authenticating and connecting with the source for verified content.
- Main Circuit Parameter Design and execution supervision & Management of the NDMS Tool.

(d) Social Media Amplification & Digital Operations

- i) All impactful events covered on Social Media Handles of Doordarshan AIR and PBNS. Various activities regarding content management including addition of Channels in the Prasar Bharati CMS, verification of the social media accounts, clearing the potential claims regarding monetization & content ownership have been carried out.
- ii) Massive growth has been observed in DD National, DD India Social Media Handles once the operations had been handed over to PBNS & DP.
- iii) PB Ladakh was created for perception management.
- iv) Various activities regarding content management including addition of Channels in the Prasar Bharati CMS, verification of the social media accounts, clearing the potential claims regarding monetization & content ownership have been carried out.
- v) Total Reach of Prasar Bharati YouTube as per Content Management System for the year is: Impressions 14.7 Billion.

F. IT Initiatives:

The IT Division has developed many online portals/software in-house during the said period.

G. IMPORTANT ACTIVITIES AND ACHIEVEMENTS:

- Prasar Bharati plans to adopt new and emerging technologies like digital terrestrial broadcasting (5G, DRM/HD-Radio), Artificial Intelligence, etc., and is partnering with premier institutions of eminence like IIT Kanpur for R&D in these emerging areas. It is also engaging with Indian start-ups in line with the goal of an Atma Nirbhar Bharat.
- Content Innovation is a major thrust area and has seen synergy across radio and television, language amplification to address the wide diversity, and creating value from the rich archives. While focusing on its primary mission of public service broadcasting, popular content in new and innovative formats produced in collaboration with best in the industry has given a new fillip and boost to the entertainment fare on the networks. The international footprint of DD India-- the international channel of Doordarshan-- has also grown in the last one year making it popular among the large Indian diaspora spread across the globe.
- DD Free Dish which is a free to air (FTA) DTH service has been recently augmented. Its present bouquet contains 161 TV channels (including 1 HD), 38 DD channels, 2 Parliamentary channels, 51 co-branded educational channels, 2 foreign public broadcasting channels and 65 private GEC, movie, news, music and 48 radio channels. Currently available in 38 million households, it is the largest DTH platform in the country.
- Both AIR and Doordarshan are repositories of priceless archival collections of music, plays, serials etc., besides content of historical importance which have been completely digitized and have been made available online.
- With 485 broadcasting centres of All India Radio and 66 Doordarshan Kendras spread across the length and breadth of the country, Prasar Bharati offers one of the most effective communication platforms for developmental outreach and commercial messaging.

CHAPTER II

GLOBAL OUTREACH

Global Outreach Wing of Prasar Bharati deals with the activities related to international relations such as signing of Agreements and Memorandums of Understanding (MoUs) with Public Service Broadcasters/ Organisations of foreign countries. It facilitates the official visits of foreign broadcasters to all the verticals of Prasar Bharati, organizing In-Country/Sub-Regional workshops/ conferences/ events for Prasar Bharati involving International Broadcasting organisations such as ABU, AIBD etc and coordination of participation of its officials in international competitions /events/conferences both held abroad or in India.

- **MoU with SBC:** MoU between Prasar Bharati, India, and Public Broadcaster of Seychelles Broadcasting Corporation, Seychelles (SBC) on Cooperation and Collaboration on Broadcasting was signed on 17.8.2021. High Commissioner of India to Seychelles, Gen. Dalbir Singh Suhag signed the MoU on behalf of Prasar Bharati, while Mr. Berard Dupres, CEO SBC signed it on behalf of the SBC, Seychelles.

- **MoU with KBS Korea:** A MoU between Prasar Bharati and KBS Korea was renewed on 21.12.2021 for one more year (i.e. 01.01.2022 to 31.12.2022) with mutual consent for hosting of DD India channel on **Myk app** platform.
- **MoU with Yupp TV USA:** A MoU between Prasar Bharati and Yupp TV was signed and exchanged on 07.03.2022 for hosting of DD India channel on Yupp TV OTT platform. As per the MoU, Yupp TV will carry the DD India in US, UK, Europe, Australia, Malaysia and Middle East.
- **MoU with Deutsche Welle, Germany (Eco-India):** A MoU between Prasar Bharati and Deutsche Welle, Germany got signed on 14.03.2022 that enables Doordarshan to dub, translate, subtitle and telecast the programme 'Eco-India' in Hindi/English/Regional languages on different channels of Doordarshan with aim to enhance the recognition of "Eco-India" in the territory of India.
- **MoU with SBS Australia:** A MoU between Prasar Bharati and Special Broadcasting Service (SBS), Australia was signed on 17.03.2022 in the field of content exchange, capacity building and exchange of training.
- **MoU with FBC Fiji:** A MoU between Prasar Bharati and Fiji Broadcasting Corporation (FBC) Fiji was signed on 24.05.2017 in the field of content exchange, capacity building, trainings and co-production of contents. In this connection an addendum to the said MoU between Prasar Bharati & Fijian Broadcast Corporation (FBC) for exchange of audio-video Programmes was also signed on 18.03.2022.

CHAPTER III

CAPACITY BUILDING –TRAINING INFRASTRUCTURE

NATIONAL INSTITUTE OF BROADCASTING & MULTIMEDIA (NABM)

1. INTRODUCTION

The National Academy of Broadcasting and Multimedia (NABM), Delhi is the premier training academy of Prasar Bharati. It is responsible for training of in-service programme, engineering and administrative personnel working at various stations and offices of All India Radio and Doordarshan. The prime objective of the Academy is to develop & nurture the broadcast professionals for their optimum performance in the dynamic ever challenging broadcasting environment. Over time, NABM has emerged as the leading institution to impart training in the field of radio and television production, post-production and broadcasting for broadcasters in the Asia-Pacific region.

The NABM has modern infrastructure to impart world class training keeping pace with technological changes. Class rooms are equipped with latest audio/visual facilities, Radio & TV studios with latest production and post-production equipment, measurement lab, computer lab, networking lab, Radio & TV transmitters. It has a library with collection of over 11000 books. The academy has excellent hostel facilities with 125 rooms.

2. HISTORY

The Training facility was established as an attached office of DG:AIR, New Delhi in 1948.

NABM (Technical) erstwhile STI (T), part of the AIR Directorate since 1985, now functions at Kingsway Camp, Delhi. It organizes Training Courses for the engineering staff of All India Radio and Doordarshan from the level of Technician to the Additional Director General. It also conducts the departmental, qualifying and the competitive examinations. Initially, NABM (Technical) had a campus at Bhubaneswar and a Regional Academy of Broadcasting & Multimedia at Shillong and Mumbai (Malad) also.

NABM(Programme) erstwhile STI(P), shifted to the present location at Radio Colony, Kingsway Camp, Delhi as subordinate office of DG:AIR on 1st January 1990. It is responsible for training of in-service Programme and Administrative personnel working at various stations and offices of All India Radio and Doordarshan. Subsequently, six Regional Training Institutes namely, NABM Bhubaneswar & Regional Academy of Broadcasting & Multimedia (RABMs) at

Ahmedabad, Hyderabad, Lucknow, Shillong and Thiruvananthapuram came into existence in different zones covering the entire country with a mandate to impart training to the staff of AIR & Doordarshan.

In 2016, the supervision and management of NABM was taken up by the Prasar Bharati Secretariat. In 2019 the Regional Academies located at Ahmedabad, Hyderabad, Lucknow, Thiruvananthapuram, and Mumbai (Malad) including DTI, Lucknow have been closed down as part of rationalization measures undertaken by Prasar Bharati.

Presently there are three academies working at three locations namely NABM Delhi; NABM Bhubaneswar; and RABM Shillong and they train over 3500 engineering/ programme/ administrative personnel every year. NABM collaborates with Asia Pacific Institute for Broadcasting Development (AIBD) and Asia Pacific Broadcasting Union (ABU) to organize trainings/workshops for the radio and television engineering personnel of various countries in Asia Pacific region. It also collaborates with organizations like - United Nations Children's Emergency Fund (UNICEF) and National Institute of Disaster Management (NIDM) for specific training modules for the Programme Personnel of AIR & DD.

3. DETAILS OF THE TRAINING ACTIVITIES (PROGRAMME AND ENGINEERING DIVISIONS)

Due to the lockdown and official tour restrictions imposed because of outbreak of the pandemic COVID-19, NABM, Delhi and other institutes switched to online training programme using CISCO WebEx Meeting application from the conventional Face to Face classroom teaching. During the lockdown period, it conducted several webinars on various broadcast subjects. Subsequently, it conducted scheduled training activities as per the Annual Training Calendar (ATC). A number of special and demand/need based online training and Webinars were also conducted for Engineering, Programme and Administrative staff of AIR /DD by using Virtual Conference system.

A. TECHNICAL COURSES:

Webinar on SOP (Standard Operating Procedures) for Transmission in 16:9 aspect ratio and In depth understanding of SD transmission in 16:9 Aspect Ratio and Use of FFmpeg and Casparcg to make SD to 16:9 SD were organized for DD officials. Some webinars like E-Office & CAS, Social Media In Broadcasting .Web based training program on Power Quality Solution-Reactive Power & harmonics, File based workflow in TV studios, Orientation course for EA, Computer Hardware, Software and Network Maintenance and Training for PAs/Stenos on Excel/Power point/MS word/Email and internet application, Training on E-Account module of CAS for Zonal Offices were also organized.

NABM specializes in conducting trainings giving practical knowledge. In online mode conducting such trainings is a challenge and requires meticulous planning. One such course conducted was LED/LCD TV repairing workshop for technicians and AIR Conditioning System: Concepts and Maintenance Techniques for Sr. Tech/Tech. Maintaining interest of participants for 5 days course or more is challenging in online format. Attendance of candidates is taken from meeting data and online certificates are issued to candidates. Course feedback is also taken online by Google feedback forms. Online courses are designed with a vision to foster and facilitate the attributes of the staff and also to increase awareness in order to meet the challenges of changing times vis-à-vis media/broadcasting.

CHAPTER IV

COMMON FACILITIES FOR AIR AND DOORDARSHAN

A. PRASAR BHARATI ARCHIVES

Prasar Bharati Archives is a treasure trove of not only the memorable performances of great artistes, who have contributed to India's rich cultural, music and dance heritage but also a collection of rare media assets related to important events like Independence Day celebrations, Republic Day Parades, address to the nation by Prime Ministers, Presidents etc. as well as other important broadcasts since the advent of broadcasting in our country. These rare assets are in the form of sound recordings and a/v footage in the all genres like music, dance, drama, interviews, short films, documentaries, feature films etc.

Archival activities started in the form of Transcription & Programme Exchange Service (T&PES) on 3rd April, 1954 by entrusting the main function of preparing transcription of speeches of all dignitaries with a special reference to the Presidents & the Prime Ministers of India. Though, informal archiving had been there in the country, setting up of transcription service converted it as an organized activity. Doordarshan Archives was established in 2004 with an objective to digitize and preserve the valuable audio-visual footage. Though, initially the archival setups in AIR and Doordarshan have grown separately under respective verticals. These setups were combined and brought under a common umbrella as a separate vertical "Prasar Bharati Archives" in 2018.

Objectives

Collection, digitization and preservation of media assets in the form of sound recordings and audio- visuals acquired across All India Radio and Doordarshan Network is the primary objective of Prasar Bharati Archives. The objective includes preservation of legacy media in digital domain for posterity, research and nurturing arts and culture. Archival content is also repurposed for feeding the AIR/DD channels and OTT platforms along with the focus on monetization of media assets in order to generate revenue for Prasar Bharati.

Set up

Prasar Bharati has established a setup for identification and archiving of the media assets available in all AIR and Doordarshan Kendras across the country. The archiving setup has following establishments: -

1. Central Archives (Central & North Zone), New Delhi

2. Zonal Archives East Zone, Kolkata
3. Zonal Archives West Zone, Mumbai
4. Zonal Archives South Zone, Chennai
5. Zonal Archives North East Zone, Guwahati

The archiving set up at different regions/zones are engaged in identification, digitization and archiving of precious media assets available at various stations/ Kendras.

Central Archives Prasara Bharati

Central Archives has been established at Akashvani Bhavan, Sansad Marg, New Delhi. It caters to the archiving needs of the North and Central zone of Prasara Bharati. Central Archives functions with two wings namely:

1. AIR Archives & 2. DD Archives.

1. AIR Archives

a. Digital Sound Archives/Library

The Digital Sound Archives is a rich repository of priceless recordings/autobiographies of eminent personalities, freedom fighters, National leaders such as Netaji Subhash Chandra Bose, Mahatma Gandhi, J.R.D Tata, Ustad Ali Akbar Khan, Harivansh Rai Bachchan and Dr. Verghese Kurien. Apart from this, rare music (classical, light classical & folk) recordings, Dramas, features, documentaries, lectures & Sanskaar Geet are preserved in the library.

- b. Programme Exchange Unit** circulates radio programmes like serials, features, community singing songs, Dramas and monthly chain plays among the AIR stations spread across the country. It also used to provide audio listening/previewing facilities to Govt. & Pvt. Organizations & research scholars for research and commercial purposes as per request.

c. Digitization Unit

AIR wing of Central Archives has taken up a Mega project of digitizing all the analogue content. Work includes digitization of Tapes & CDs received from National Channel, All India Radio, Delhi, Drama Unit of DG:AIR and Sanskaar Geet Programmes from DG:AIR along with replication (Data Backup) of Digitized Programmes as Disaster Copies to be stored at Bhopal And Bengaluru. After Digitization, work of cataloguing of important programmes and maintaining data in Library Managemnet System is performed.

d. Transcription Service Unit

This unit transcribes and preserves the recording of speeches delivered by the Presidents & Prime Ministers of India.

e. Refurbishing Unit

This Unit takes care of enhancing the audio quality of the archival value recordings of AIR Archives available in Central Archives. Work includes refurbishing, editing & watermarking of recordings and providing to social media unit for upload after due preview/approval.

f. Commercial Releases & Marketing

This Unit provides Audio assets such as speeches, features, documentaries etc. on commercial and non-commercial basis along with licenses. Many ACD/DVDs titles out of its rich archives have been released over the years. These releases were earlier sold online through www.amazon.in and Prasar Bharati Archives website.

g. Repurposing Unit

AIR Archives has been re-purposing the archival content of Akashvani as new programme for broadcast. The archival contents of public interest are also repackaged for OTT/Social Media platforms.

Important Activities of AIR Archives (2021-22):

- During 1st April, 2021 to 31st March, 2022, AIR Archives digitization unit has digitized 1265 hours (Analogue Tapes) of programmes. Total Digitization done is 40,488 Hours (1,34,271 No. of Programmes) as on 31.03.2022.
- Digitization of programmes (conversion from analogue audio to digital signal) and transfer in SAN server for storing in LTO. (17,881 Hrs. 52,565 No. of Programmes).
- 52 episodes programmes series named “Sangralaya Ke Galiyaron Se” based on rare AIR archives content were produced by the Central Archives and broadcast on Indraprastha, Rajdhani, FM Gold & FM Rainbow Channel of All India Radio.
- From 31.12.2021 sale of CD/DVDs has been discontinued in view of meagre demand in the market due to obsolescence of the media as well as play out equipment for CD/DVDs.
- During the F.Y.2021-22, Programme Exchange unit has provided curated recordings of Sangeet Sammelan and released CD/DVDs content for uploading on Prasar Bharati Archives and AIR Raagam YouTube channel .All CD/DVDs contents have been uploaded for its digital marketing and presence.
- Storage Area Network system was upgraded from 6TB to 24 TB & transferring the storage data in LTO -7 tapes.
- Maintained AIR tape libraries consisting 65,777 Nos. of digitized legacy Tapes/CDs of audio assets as on 31st March 2021.

2. DD Archives

a. Video Library/Archives

Video Library of Central Archives is a content rich library and a central repository of tapes received from various DD Kendras across Prasar Bharati network. Library acts as

the core of archiving activities in the setup. It has huge collection of variety of tapes in the legacy analogue and new digital format.

b. Digitization and Archiving

Analogue media contents generated by DD Kendras are digitized and preserved in Media Assets Management (MAM) System. Born digital content is being archived in the directly in the MAM system. There are different legacy formats viz U-Matic, BCN, Betacam and DVC Pro etc. for media. Dubbing/ transfer suits are installed for dubbing of contents from legacy formats U-Matic, BCN, Betacam to DVC Pro-50. Maintenance of all these equipment is carried out by available Engineering staff.

c. Library Information System

An online library information system has been deployed for searching/cataloguing of media assets available in various programme libraries of AIR Stations and Doordarshan network.

d. Cleaning and Restoration of Legacy Media

Legacy tapes are thoroughly checked for any kind of damage. They are cleaned and the content is restored if the need arises before digitisation. High quality video digital restoration and noise reduction system are instated for the purpose. Any type of problem/ailment on videos is corrected on High Quality Digital Restoration System (Archangel) and Digital Noise Reduction System (Puritan). These systems were installed in 2008. Spares for these equipment are not available even with the OEMs. Engineering staff itself performs operation/ maintenance of these machines without AMC from outside agencies.

e. Repackaging/ Repurposing

Digitized archival content is curated/ repackaged for telecast purposes by DD Kendras. The archival content of public interest are also repackaged for OTT/Social Media platforms.

f. Programme Exchange

For the purpose of exchanging programmes among Doordarshan Kendras, a pool of selected programmes has been maintained in Central Archives. This content is frequently used for exchange among DD Kendras for telecast purpose.

g. Footage Sale

Media assets are available for sale on commercial and non- commercial basis along with licenses.

Important Activities of DD Archives (2021-22):

- DD Archives has deep archived 24,324 Hrs. of content till date through Media Asset Management system (MAM), out of which 111 Hrs. of content has been archived during

the period from 1st April 2021 to 31st March 2022.

- Total 34,232 Hours 34 min. of legacy content has been dubbed/digitized and stored in digital tapes up to 31st March 2022, out of which 1476 Hrs 12 Mts. of content has been digitized during the period from 1st April 2021 to 31st March 2022.
- Till now 59,415 Nos. of inventories have been fed in the online Library Management System (LMS) till date, out of which 286 Nos. of entries have been done during the period from 1st April 2021 to 31st March 2022.
- Under Programme exchange scheme, DD Archives provided 13,213 Hours of contents to various channels viz. DD National, DD Bharati, DD Retro among others in the network. Out of which 1612 Hrs. of content provided during the period from 1st April 2021 to 31st March 2022.
- Different Non-Linear editing systems viz Canopus Edius Pro and FCPs etc. NREPs setups and two nos. of Casper CG play out servers are installed at DD Archives for making/transcoding/transferring programmes for Social Media were maintained.

ABOUT CIVIL CONSTRUCTION WING: ALL INDIA RADIO

1.0 Overview

The Civil Construction Wing, All India Radio (CCW, AIR) was established in 1971 to assign Civil Works to various Organizations under the Ministry of Information & Broadcasting, Government of India. Before this, CPWD carried out all the Civil Works pertaining to various Organizations under the Ministry of Information & Broadcasting, Government of India. The Civil Construction Wing, All India Radio, (CCW, AIR) undertakes the Construction and Maintenance of various types of Office Buildings, Residential Buildings, Radio Studios, TV Studios, Roads, RCC and Steel Towers, Steel Mast, and other Development Works for Prasar Bharati (All India Radio and Doordarshan), Other Media Units under the Ministry of Information and Broadcasting. The CCW AIR also undertakes Civil works for other Ministries, Departments, Autonomous Bodies, Public Sector Banks, and Public Sector Enterprises etc. as Deposit Works all over India. The CCW was declared Central Public Works Organization (CPWO) by the Ministry of Information and Broadcasting, Government of India, New Delhi on 31st January 2008. The Rule 133(2) of General Finance Rules (GFR) recognizes the Civil Wing (CCW) of the Ministry of Information & Broadcasting as Public Works Organization. The CCW follows the CPWD pattern for the execution of Works. The CCW has a manpower of Civil Engineers, Electrical Engineers and Architects. Administratively, the CCW is part of the Directorate General, All India Radio and is headed by the Chief Engineer, who reports to DG, AIR through Engineer-in-Chief. At Headquarter of Civil Construction Wing, New Delhi, Chief Engineer is assisted by Superintending Surveyor of Works, Architect Units, Engineer Officers, Financial Advisor and other complementary staff working with these officers. There is one Superintending Engineer (Training) at Delhi who reports to Engineer-in-Chief, All India Radio. The Superintending Engineer (Training) is responsible for quality assurance & introducing/ updating of technology and imparting training to officers and staff of CCW about new materials, standards and specifications and innovations in the field of Construction Technology.

The CCW has its presence throughout the country and has 7 Civil Circles, 3 Electrical Circles, 24 Civil Divisions, 11 Electrical divisions and one Architectural Unit. Overall technical manpower in CCW is 427 numbers in position as in January 2022 for construction and maintenance of AIR & Doordarshan buildings as well as Deposit Works from Kargil to Kanyakumari and Ziro (Arunachal Pradesh) to Bhuj (Gujarat).

eOffice has been implemented in CCW across the Country during the pandemic, resulting in carrying out office work promptly without using physical Files and facilitating work from home.

Various Virtual trainings were conducted during the Pandemic with the participation of Officers and employees across the Country. Digitization of Physical Files under the Executive Engineer (Training) was completed.

The Civil Construction Wing has the credit of constructing of tallest RCC and RCC cum Steel TV Towers across the country.

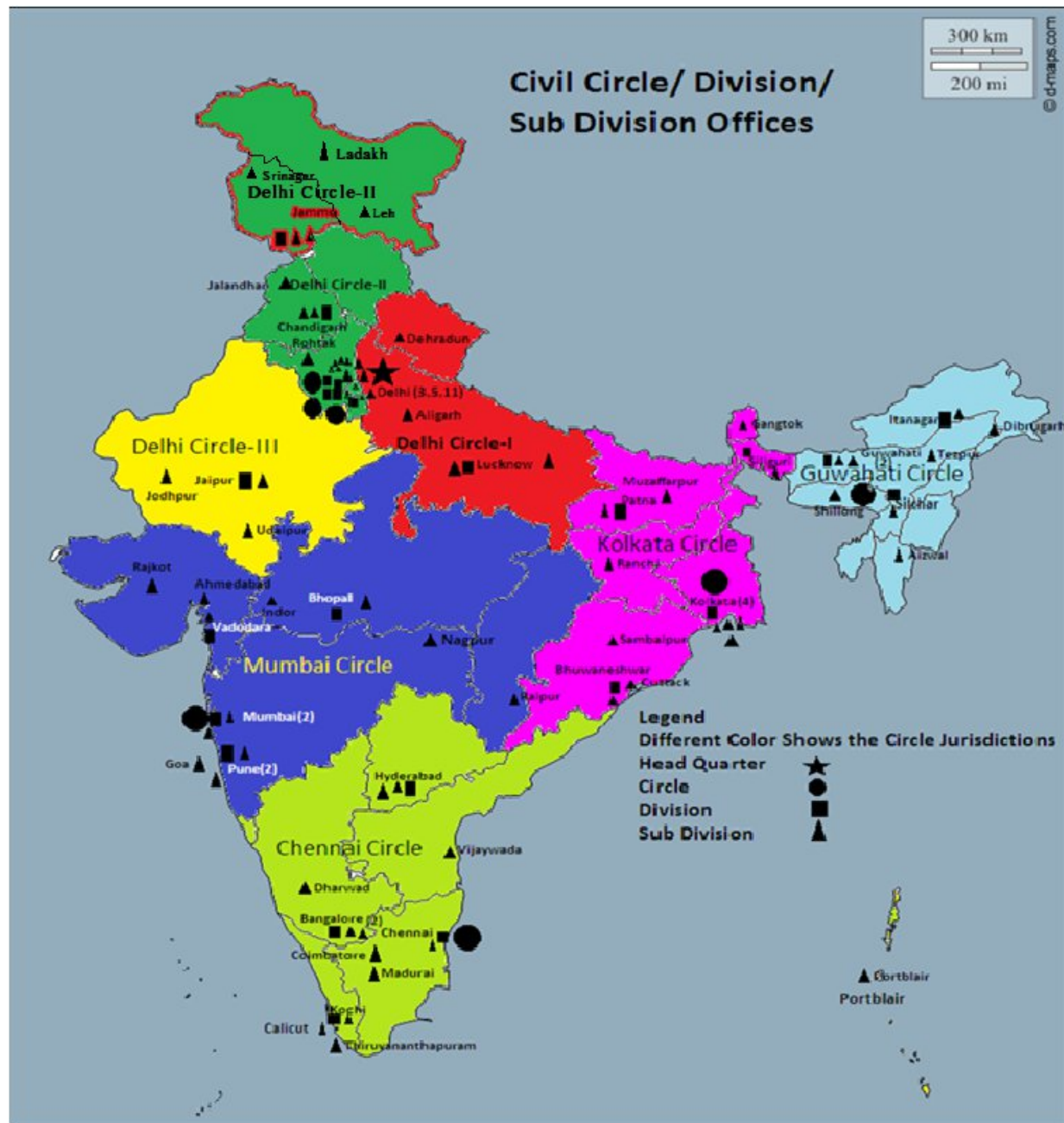

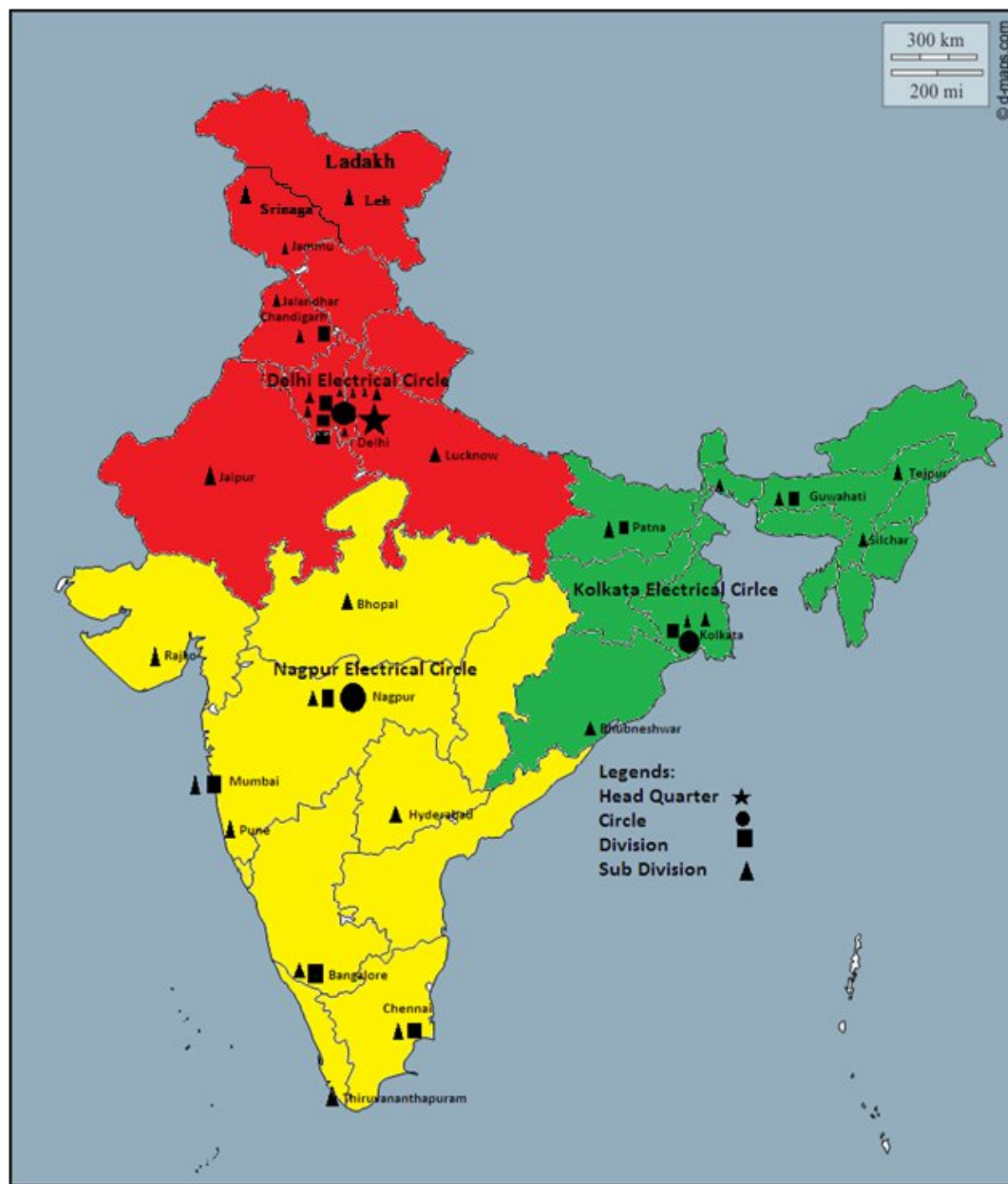

C. RECRUITMENT:

In exercise of the powers conferred by sub-section (1) of section 10 read with clauses (d) and (e) of sub-section (2) of section 32 of the Prasar Bharati Act, 1990, a notification titled Prasar Bharati (Broadcasting Corporation of India) Establishment of Recruitment Board Rules, 2020 has been issued by Ministry of Information and Broadcasting in the Gazette of India Extraordinary dated 12.02.2020.

D. RESERVATION:

I. Reservation for SCs/STs/OBCs:

Prasar Bharati has taken requisite measures for implementation of the reservation policy in respect of SC/ST/OBC categories of employees by setting up a dedicated SC/ST Cell. SC/ST cell ensures due compliance of the order on reservation issued from time to time in favour of SC/ST. All relevant policy directions and instructions issued by Nodal Ministries/Departments for extending benefits to SCs/STs/OBCs in Government service are widely circulated to all subordinate/ field offices by respective Directorates for implementation.

The recommendations of Hon'ble National Commission for Scheduled Castes (NCSC) and Hon'ble National Commission for Scheduled Tribes (NCST), as reflected in their Annual Reports, are disseminated at various levels for strict implementation. Consolidated annual statements on representation of reserved category employees and data on other specific information relating to appointment and vacancies in respect of reserved categories employees are being submitted to concerned authorities periodically. Necessary action is also being taken for redressal of grievances of employees through grievance redressal mechanism.

II. Reservation for Persons with Disabilities (PwDs):

The Constitution of India ensures equality, freedom, justice and dignity of all individuals and implicitly mandates an inclusive society for all including the persons with disabilities. The Government of India enacted "The Persons with Disabilities (Equal Opportunities, Protection of Rights and Full Participation) Act, 1995", in an effort to ensure equal opportunities for persons with disabilities and their full participation in nation building. The PwD Act has come into force in 1996. Subsequently Government of India had passed "The Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016" which came into force from 19th April 2017 and related instruction related to reservation was issued by Department of Personnel and Training vide O.M. dated 15.01.2018. With the enactment reservation for persons with disabilities was made applicable in identified Group A, B and C posts also in case of direct recruitment.

As regards promotions, reservation is available when promotions are made from Group 'D'(erstwhile) to Group 'C' and within Group 'C' identified posts.

Prasar Bharati has taken all requisite measures for implementation of reservation for PWDs. All relevant policy decisions and instructions issued by DoPT from time to time are being followed.

Prasar Bharati broadcasts programmes on Persons with Disabilities through its channels. Programmes cover Schemes for Welfare of Persons with Disabilities being implemented by the Central and State Governments. Programmes relating to their health, social and cultural concerns are also included. The content of programmes is so designed that it not only helps them to get benefits of welfare schemes of the Government but also encourages them to live with dignity. The programmes are crucial from the point of view of social awareness and are also useful in changing the insensitive attitude of people towards Persons with Disabilities.

Although there is no specific Budget Head for the benefit of Persons with disabilities, activities like construction of ramps, special toilets preferably on the ground floors of offices, are undertaken from the 'Minor Works' budget Head of CCW, AIR.

F. HANDLING OF COURT CASES:

Prasar Bharati monitors Court cases and Arbitration cases through the Legal information Management & Briefing System (LIMBS) of Department of Legal Affairs. Concerted effort has been made to bring all litigation on the portal. LIMBS Version-2.0 has also been implemented and all court cases are being uploaded & updated. Nodal Officers have been appointed for regular monitoring of progress of litigations. A system of Centralised Monthly Review has been introduced at the Prasar Bharati Secretariat. The current break up of Court Cases and Commercial Cases is given below:

- Arranging for Hindi Training, Hindi Typing/ Shorthand training under Hindi Teaching Scheme.
- Organising Hindi Diwas/ Hindi Mah etc. and competitions to promote use of Hindi.
- Ensuring the usage of Unicode to work in Hindi on all computers of Prasar Bharati Secretariat.
- Translation of any other Reports and Returns, texts as per requirement.

ii) Progressive use of Hindi in DG: Doordarshan

Hindi Section in the Directorate General of Doordarshan reviews the position relating to the progressive use of Hindi in the Directorate and its subordinate offices and makes all efforts to promote the progressive use of Hindi.

In this reference the major works done by the section during the period 1 April, 2021 to March, 2022 are as follows:-

- All documents under Section 3(3) of the Official Language Act, 1963 were issued in bi-lingual form and all letters received in Hindi were replied to in Hindi.
- Hindi fonts were installed in computers of DG: DD.
- To review the position of the compliance of Official Language policy in the Directorate, meetings of the Official Language Implementation Committee were held on regular basis.
- Hindi workshops were organized successfully in every quarter to create awareness among officers and employees to motivate them to do their work in Hindi.
- During the period around 24 DDKs/DMCs/HPTs were inspected and review reports were sent.
- In order to ascertain the status of progressive use of Hindi, Official Language inspection of the internal sections was done.
- Quarterly Progressive Reports for every quarter relating to the progressive use of Hindi, received from various sections of Doordarshan Directorate were consolidated and sent to the Department of Official Language, M/O of Home Affairs and M/O of I & B.
- Hindi translation of the Annual Report (2020-21) of Prasar Bharati was done.
- Hindi translation of starred and unstarred questions received from the Ministry of Information and Broadcasting was done during the period.
- Official Language inspection of DDK, Leh and DDK, Gangtok was successfully conducted by Parliament Committee on Official Language in the months of July and October, 2021 respectively.
- Hindi fortnight was celebrated in DG:DD and circular was issued to different Kendra etc. for celebrating Hindi fortnight. Prizes were distributed to winner participants by CEO, Prasar Bharati and DG, Doordarshan.
- Sections of DG:DD were notified to do maximum official work in Hindi under Rule 8(4) of Official Language Rules, 1976.
- Circulars were issued to sections of DG:DD and its subordinate offices regarding implementation of Hindi Protsahan Yojana of Deptt. of Official Language, MHA for Official
- Language inspection of DDK, Agartala was successfully conducted by Parliament Committee on Official Language in the months of March 2022.

(iii) Progressive use of Hindi in All India Radio:

The Hindi Unit of DG: AIR (Headquarter) is fully committed towards compliance and implementation of the Official Language Policy of Union of India and constantly strives to implement the orders/instructions issued from time to time by Ministry of Home Affairs, Department of Official Language and achieving targets mentioned in Annual Programme in various AIR stations/offices. Hindi Divas/Hindi Fortnight

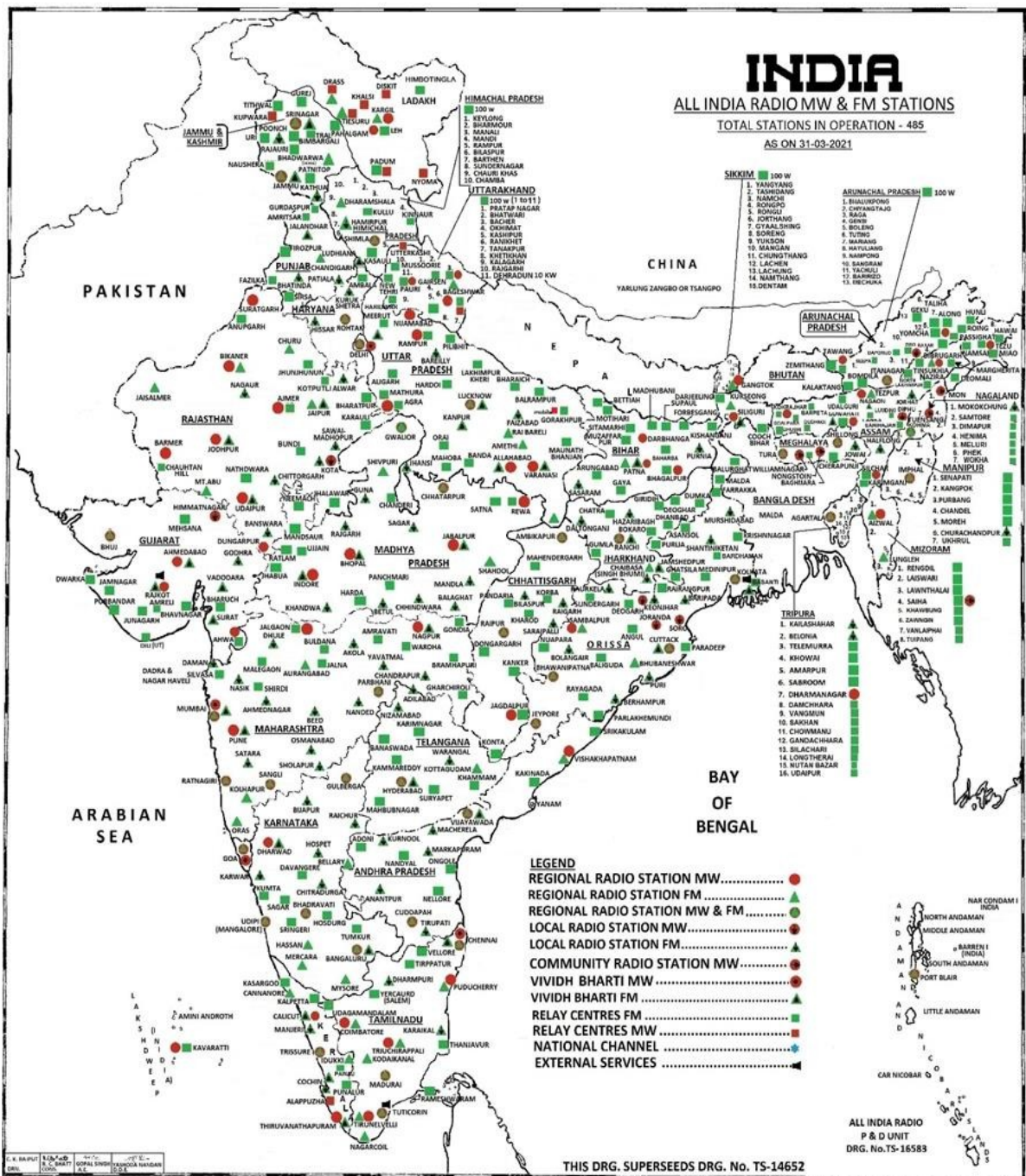

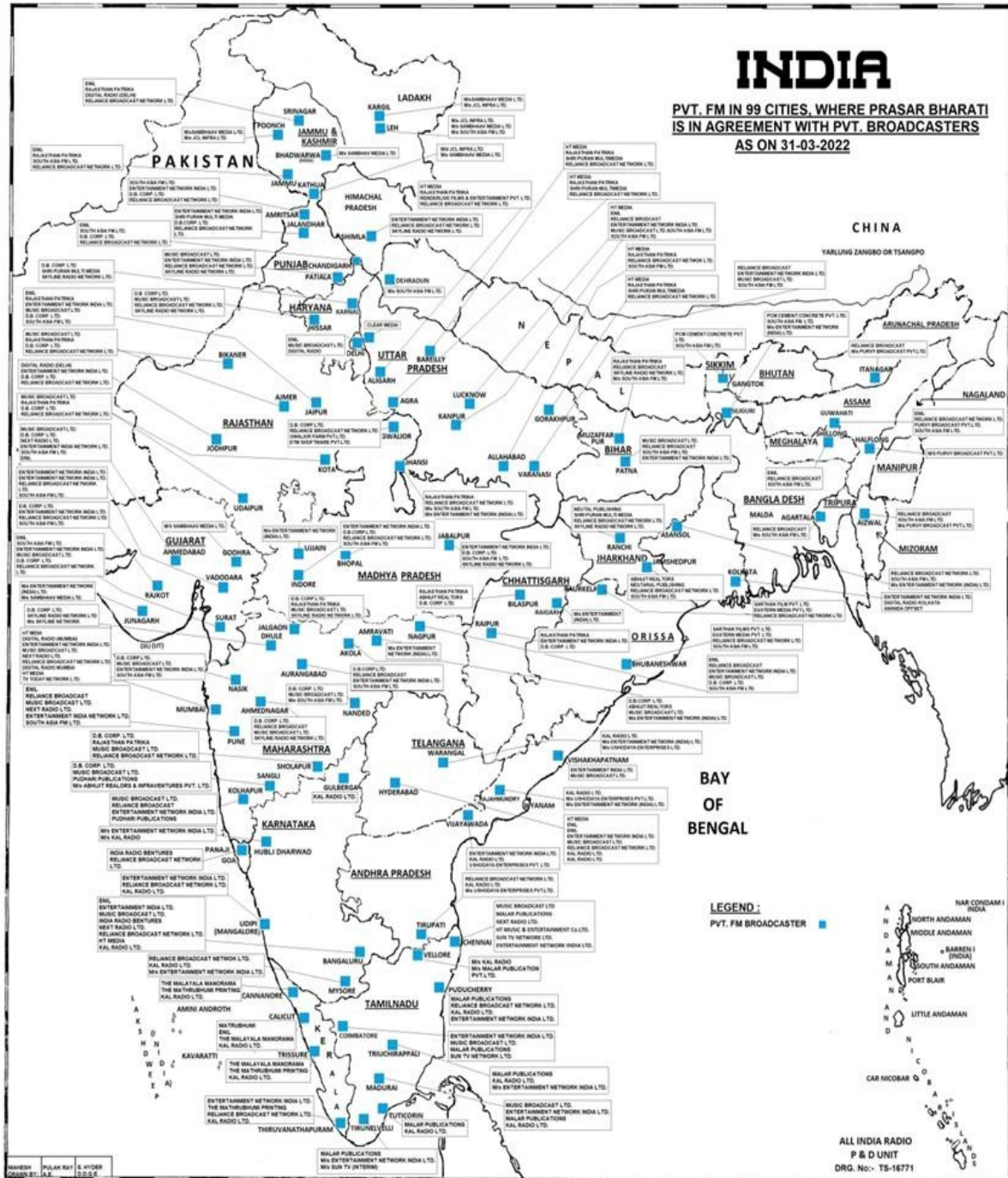

Locations of 99 cities, where Prasar Bharati is in agreement with Pvt. FM Broadcasters

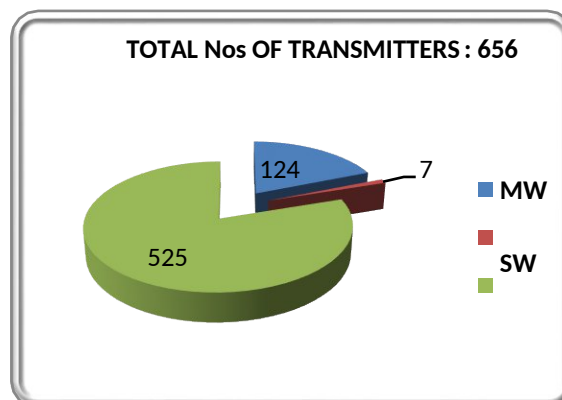
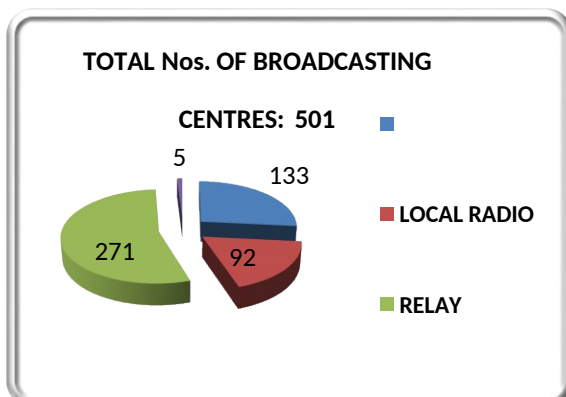

CHAPTER VI

ALL INDIA RADIO

A. INTRODUCTION:

All India Radio (AIR) (Bahujana Hitaya Bahujana Sukhaya) aims to provide information, education and entertainment for promoting the welfare and happiness of the masses

The phenomenal growth achieved by All India Radio over the past eight decades has made it one of the largest media organizations in the world. Now, it has 501 Stations and 656 Transmitters. To meet the communication needs of our multicultural society the network expanded adopting new technologies and programme production techniques

To realise its objectives, AIR has evolved over the years, a three-tier system of broadcasting namely National, Regional and Local. AIR Stations provide news, music and spoken word programmes to almost the entire population of the country. Its vast reach especially in the rural and tribal areas makes it the primary and sometimes the only source of information and entertainment.

The National Programmes which are heard on the Medium Wave in most parts of the country cater to the first-tier of broadcasting. The Regional and Sub-regional stations form the second tier of broadcasting with programmes in the regional languages /dialects and promoting regional and cultural facets. In addition, FM Channels cater to the needs of the people primarily the youth. The Vividh Bharati National Service also primarily on FM Channels is available at 43 places across the country. The 92 stations on FM mode, set up to cater to the needs and tastes of the audiences of small towns in various parts of the country are the Local Radio Stations (LRS) providing the third-tier broadcasting. All India Radio has also set-up Community Radio Service at five places in the North Eastern Region as the voice of the local tribal population.

B. ORGANIZATIONAL STRUCTURE:

All India Radio is headed by a Director General assisted by Additional Directors General (ADGs) Programme, Administration and Finance Wings; and an Engineer-in-Chief in the Engineering Wing. News Wing is headed by a Director General (News).

Directorate General, All India Radio, is responsible for policy formulation, planning and development, infrastructure and technology upgradation, budgetary planning and control, human resource management; overseeing operations and maintenance activities, etc.

Earlier Programming in All India Radio were divided into eleven Programming Regions: at Delhi (Northern Region-I&II), Mumbai (Western Region-I&II), Bengaluru (Southern Region-I&II), Lucknow (Central Region-I), Bhopal (Central Region-II), Kolkata (Eastern Region-I & II)

and Guwahati (North Eastern Region); and Engineering into five Zones located at Delhi (North Zone), Kolkata (East Zone), Mumbai (West Zone), Guwahati (North-East Zone) and Chennai (South Zone) for project and maintenance engineering activities.

These Zones have now been restructured as North Zone (in Delhi), South Zone (in Chennai), East Zone (in Kolkata), West Zone (in Mumbai) and North East Zone (in Guwahati) on geographical basis. In addition, a National Zone is also created to supervise the National Content of Doordarshan and All India Radio. ADG level officers are posted as Zonal Head (Content Operations), Zonal Head (Broadcast Operations) and Zonal Head (Administration) at each of these Zones.

C. SERVICES AND CHANNELS OF AIR:

i. Regional Channels:

Regional (Primary) Channels of AIR are located in the state capitals and in major linguistic-cultural regions of every state. 133 such channels are spread over 28 states and 8 Union territories (UTs) of the country. The Regional Channels put out infotainment programmes in languages and dialects of the region with the objective of enriching the lives of their listeners. They broadcast largely on the Medium Wave with many channels having FM support and are also live streamed.

They promote art and culture with an emphasis on Indian classical music. Around 40 percent of the total broadcast comprises music, which includes Classical music, light folk and film music. News and current affairs constitute 20 to 30 percent of the broadcast time. Radio plays, health & family welfare programmes, programmes for women and children, farm and home programmes are some other spoken word programmes aimed at empowering rural masses are the other important segments of the primary channels. These channels being the most accessible to all, strive to reach their audiences in the languages most understood.

ii. Local Radio Stations (LRS):

At present, 92 Local Radio Stations are located across the country. These stations are catering to the local population of the area, providing utility services and reach right into the heart of the community which uses the microphone to reflect and enrich its life. What distinguishes Local Radio from the regional network is its down to earth, intimate, and uninhibited approach. The programmes of the local radio are area-specific. They are flexible and spontaneous enough to enable the station to function as the mouthpiece of the local community.

In the present scenario, as most of the LRS of AIR are on FM, Vividh Bharati Programmes are relayed by most of them besides local content. At present, most of the Local Radio Stations are broadcasting for the duration of 17 Hrs. out of which, 7 hours are Vividh Bharati relay. The content is approximately 60% local and 40% relay (including News and other relay programmes

of regional stations)

iii. Community Radio Stations (CRS):

Community Radio centres were set up at 5 places in the North Eastern Region to serve the local tribal population.

iv. FM Rainbow:

FM Rainbow channel of All India Radio was launched at a time when radio listening was declining especially in big cities. FM radio provided the necessary fillip ensuring noise-free high-quality music. Informal presentation on FM suited the changing tastes of listeners catching the pulse of the youth with 24x7 broadcast. Inter-personal chatting style of the comperes caught the pulse of youth and allured them to come close to their radio. In its round-the-clock broadcast, the radio listeners were served with a recipe of whole new gamut of entertainment. Soon FM radio acquired the status of modern radio because it was speaking in their style and providing them the listening pleasure.

At present, AIR has 525 FM transmitters across the country, by which it covers 58.78% of the area and 68% of the population of the country. Out of these, FM Rainbow channel is available at 25 places i.e. Delhi, Mumbai, Chennai, Kolkata, Bengaluru, Lucknow, Panaji, Jalandhar, Kanpur, Kochi, Puducherry, Shillong, Chandigarh, Cuttack, Kodaikanal, Tiruchirapalli, Coimbatore, Hyderabad, Vishakhapatnam, Raibareilly, Madurai, Triunelvali, Vijayawada, Patna and Ranchi. AIR FM Rainbow at four metropolitan cities is available 24x7. Besides this, Delhi Rainbow is also relayed fully from Mussoorie, Aligarh and partly from Dharamshala and Bhatinda. The FM channel includes Pop music, Film songs, Classical & Devotional music, News Headlines, etc.

v. FM Gold:

FM Gold channel came on air on 1st September 2001 at Delhi as a niche infotainment channel with around 50% of News and Current affairs component and 50% entertainment programming. At present FM Gold is available on 100.1 MHz, daily round the clock at four metros i.e. Delhi, Mumbai, Kolkata and Chennai. Since April, 2020, out of the 24 hour transmission of FM Gold, about 60% time is devoted to News and Current Affairs programmes and remaining 40% time to

infotainment programmes including Western music, Film Music, Light, Classical and devotional music. Hourly New bulletins in Hindi and English are broadcast from AIR Delhi and relayed by other FM Gold Channel at Mumbai, Kolkata and Chennai. Presently, to commemorate 75 years of Independence of Nation, programmes based on 'Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav' are being broadcast daily. Besides, other important spoken word programmes based on Gandhian Philosophy and Yoga

are also being aired from the FM Gold Channel. This channel provides wholesome information interlinked with entertainment and keeps its listeners engaged round the clock.

vi. Direct to Home (DTH) Service:

DTH Radio is a 24-hour Satellite Service available through the DTH platform of Prasar Bharati with up-linking facilities at Todapur, Delhi. It is not a terrestrial broadcast service and DTH programmes cannot be tuned in through the ordinary radio receiver sets. It covers the entire country as well as neighbouring countries. The programming is planned in such a way that the repetitions are kept at a minimum. The DTH Service makes different language channels available across the country. Its digital quality provides a pleasurable listening experience. The new channels during this year are Leh (Ladakh), Panaji, Puducherry, Port Blair and Gangtok.

vii. Vividh Bharati National Service (VBNS):

Vividh Bharati National Service is a 24 hours service available through satellite transmission for relay from various radio stations across the country. Vividh Bharati National Service is produced and uplinked from Mumbai.

The channel has the status of truly a National Service. This service is primarily relayed from 43 CBS-VB centres (17 hours). Vividh Bharati National Service is also relayed through 65 Local Radio Stations and 100-Watt FM transmitters located across the country. These channels are also putting out programmes in their local variation chunks in the local, languages besides the Hindi.

viii Live Streaming:

As on date 291 AIR channels including AIR live News 24x7, FM Rainbow, FM Gold, Vividh Bharati services, Raagam etc. can be listened through internet by browsing Prasar Bharati website 'prasarbharati.gov.in'. Further, these channels can also be listened by using apps namely 'NewsOnAir' on iOS and Android based mobile phones.

ix External Services:

External Services Division (ESD) of All India Radio broadcasts in various Foreign and

Indian languages reaching out to about 150 countries through Short Wave, 'NewsOnAir' App and DD Free Dish. The languages in which AIR reaches its foreign audience are Arabic, Baluchi, Burmese, Chinese, Dari, French, Indonesian, Persian, Pushto, Russian, Sinhala, Swahili, Thai and Tibetan. At present, the Indian language services targeted for the neighbourhood and also the Indian Diaspora are Bangla (Maitree), Nepali, Punjabi, Sindhi, Saraiki and Urdu.

D. NEW INITIATIVES DURING THE YEAR:

i. Engineering:

All India Radio is one of the largest broadcasting networks in the world. At the time of Independence there were Six Radio Stations and 18 Transmitters (6 MW & 12 SW) which covered 11% population and 2.5% area of the country.

By 31st March 2022, AIR network has grown to 501 stations. The total no. of transmitters have however been reduced to 656 (124 MW, 7 SW & 525 FM), which provide coverage to 98% of the population spread over 90% area of the country. This includes 208 nos. of 100 W FM transmitters installed for localized coverage of about 8-10 km radius.

ii. Programme:

1. **Azaadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav:** A special programme on 'Azadi ka Amrit Mahotsav' in different languages was broadcast from 15th August 2021 till 15th August 2022. Broadcast of a programme by the youth #AIRNxt as part of the celebrations of 'Azaadi

Ka Amrit Mahotsav' was broadcast for 52 weeks from 28th Nov, 2021 across the country in all major languages and dialects.

2. **Campaign on Government advisories & SOPs for farming community during COVID-19 pandemic:** AIR stations broadcasting 'Kisanvani' and 'Kisan Ki Baat' programmes mounted intensive awareness campaigns for the farming community of the country to strictly follow Government health advisories and specific SOPs for farmers for threshing, harvesting, procurement, marketing, transportation, sowing and other farm activities during COVID-19 pandemic times.
3. Stations mounted publicity to the address in National Conference on SOPs for **Drone Applications** in Agriculture (22.12.2021), by Union Agriculture Minister Shri Narendra Singh Tomar.
4. **Publicity to International Year of Millets-2023-** Stations mounted pre publicity campaigns on the subject for promoting wider usage and higher productivity of Millet crops.
5. **AIR with the help of UNICEF** spread the Message of Nutrition and programmes were broadcast on nutrition related themes during the National Nutrition Month in September, 2021.
6. On the occasion of reaching a milestone of vaccination of 100 crore dose to the Indian citizens, the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare released a song, which was played on AIR platform in appropriate slots.
7. Online Music gradation system for old application is open and station and recordings for CAB Audition.

iii. News Service:

1. AIR News is now on website in English, Hindi, Urdu, Assamese, Dogri, Gujarati, Marathi, Rajasthani and Tamil languages, and also available on social media platforms.
2. Regional News Units (RNUs) of News Services Division (NSD) have implemented TBS (Talent Booking System) software introduced by Prasar Bharati for casual bookings and payments
3. Automation of RNUs by using NETIA and Teleprompters to prepare and read bulletins.
4. RNUs have introduced Centralised Account System (CAS) for budget grant and demand.

5. **External Services Division was merged with News Services Division, All India Radio on 12.08.2021.** After the merger, as a result of the efforts made to revitalize the External services programmes are now broadcast in 17 languages (11 Foreign and 06 Indian Languages) and Transmission in 8 languages, viz. Arabic, Persian, Dari, Pashto, Baluchi, Chinese, Tibetan and Nepali were doubled. The services are also available in digital platform with live streaming on AIR World Service YouTube channel (<https://www.youtube.com/c/AIRWorldService>), NewsOnAir App for android and iPhone, and DD Free Dish for the listeners worldwide.
6. **New COVID-19 awareness bulletins & programmes:** Special COVID-19 bulletins in English and Hindi- 30 minutes each in the morning, day and the evening (8-9 AM, 2-3 PM, 8-9 PM) are broadcast by NSD, AIR.
7. **Corona Jagrukta Series:** A live phone-in programme was started on March 2020 between top medical experts from renowned hospitals and general public has played a crucial role in generating awareness on COVID-19 infection and dispel the myths. On **9th September, 2021** it has completed its **500th** episode and the programme continues to make its impact in creating awareness on various issues concerning COVID-19 pandemic related queries of citizens.
8. **Infobytes- Corona- Kya Kehte Hain Visheshagya:** Daily Infographics with Sound Bites of experts on all social media platforms are given.
9. **Myth busters:** Audio messages by top physicians busting myths about COVID-19 with respect to nutrition and health are broadcast.
10. **Ground Reports:** situation updates, availability of essential services, no need to panic, distribution of ration and food, community kitchens to feed needy and poor in States & UTs, relief camps for migrant workers, transport of food items and goods, sufficient supply of medicines, arrangements for PPEs, quarantine locations, contact tracing etc. are broadcast.
11. **Positive News:** Exclusive Interviews with recovered patients, vox pop keeping happy, healthy, positive & engaged, family & friends support network, self-isolation & quarantine are broadcast.
12. **COVID-19 vaccination publicity:** NSD, AIR and its 46 RNUs have been creating awareness on the Government of India's Free Vaccination Programme, through its Bulletins, News Magazine Programmes, Talk Shows and Social Media Platforms.
13. **100 Crore Vaccine Dose Milestone:** As India achieved a historic milestone of administering the 100 crore doses of COVID vaccine, NSD, AIR, its 46 RNUs and Social Media Platforms gave wide coverage to the statements made by the country's top leadership, led by the Prime Minister, Shri Narendra Modi and views of

Governors/CMs, Vaccinators, Frontline Workers and General Public in their bulletins, news magazine programmes talk shows and social media platforms.

14. **Ideas that transformed India-20 years of Good Governance:** Under the dynamic leadership of Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi, the vision of new India is taking shape with the nation making tremendous progress in all areas. In order to highlight the achievements, NSD, AIR mounted a 21-days special campaign under which theme based stories/ special programmes on various themes were broadcast from 17th September, 2021 onwards.
15. **Pariksha Pe Charcha 2021:** NSD, AIR and its 46 RNUs give a wide coverage to the Prime Minister's 'Pariksha Pe Charcha- 2021'.
16. **7th Year of Pradhan Mantri Jan-Dhan Yojana (PMJDY):** NSD: AIR devised a media action plan in August for wide publicity of the successful implementation of PMJDY.
17. **G20 and COP26:** NSD: AIR accorded a special coverage of the Prime Minister address at the G20 Summit in Rome and COP26 Summit at Glasgow.
18. **Aatmanirbar Bharat Abhiyan:** Prominent coverage was given to the Prime Minister's address to the nation with a special focus on publicizing the salient features of 'Atma Nirbhar Bharat Abhiyan.'

ii. Programme Planning and Development (PP&D) Unit:

Various services offered by AIR are broadly categorized as (i) World Services (ii) Neighbourhood Services (iii) National Services; (iv) Regional Public Services and (v) Language Specific Entertainment Services. All these services have been made available on DTH and are live streamed for access to wider audience across the globe.

Content Strategy:

All India Radio is the quintessential radio broadcasting service in the country. Broadcasting in a country like India with diversity is a daunting task. AIR through its programming network, is catering to all segments of the society in terms of ethno- linguistic, cultural characteristics, agro-climatic conditions, socio-economic status and so on. Over the years AIR has been constantly revisiting its content policy to tailor it according to the needs and aspirations of the people especially those belonging to the under privileged segments of the society. This constant re-calibration of its content policy is

also required to match up to the changing socio-economic realities of a vibrant and dynamic nations making strides in every sphere.

iii. Farm and Home Broadcast:

All India Radio has dedicated its programme broadcast services to its rural audience for more than five Decades. Farm and Home programmes are broadcast by all capital and regional stations of AIR. Programmes have been designed to cater to the day to day seasonal needs of the farming community incorporating latest information and technology for best agricultural output. The programmes are geared towards improving farm productivity and economic prosperity of the country's farming community. These programmes are broadcast daily in the morning, afternoon and evening with average duration of 60 to 100 Minutes per day for Rural Women, Children & Youth.

The Farm & Home units of AIR stations broadcast composite programmes including equal segments on rural development, hard-core agriculture and allied subjects like Horticulture, Animal Husbandry, Poultry & Dairy farming, Fisheries, Forestry, Environment Conservation, food and agro processing, dry and wasteland agriculture and also segments on employment schemes, loan, insurance, sanitation, health hygiene and nutrition etc.

AIR expanded its agriculture broadcasts with the launch of an exclusive project on **Mass Media support to Agriculture Extension entitled 'Kisanvani'** from February 2004, in collaboration with the Department of Agriculture Cooperation & Farmers' Welfare, Ministry of Agriculture & Farmers' Welfare, to keep local farmers informed about the daily market rates, weather reports and day to day information in their respective areas, at micro level. Presently **Kisanvani** is being broadcast from identified 96 AIR stations across the country. Broadcast on a narrow casting mode, the programme is mostly interactive in content involving field based recordings of farmers and studio dial outs and dial-ins with experts and farming community which are quite popular with the target audience. Since, September 2018 a new agriculture programme '**Kisan Ki Baat**', on the lines of Kisanvani, has been launched in collaboration with **Ministry of Agriculture and Farmers' Welfare, Government of**

India and is being broadcast from **FM Gold channel of AIR, Delhi.**

Following specific publicity/flagship programme content was mounted by stations during the period under consideration:

1. Campaign on Government advisories & SOPs for farming community during COVID-19 pandemic

AIR stations broadcasting 'Kisanvani' and 'Kisan Ki Baat' programmes mounted intensive awareness campaigns for the farming community of the country to strictly follow Government health advisories and specific SOPs for farmers for threshing, harvesting, procurement, marketing, transportation, sowing and other farm activities during COVID-19 pandemic times. Instructions were issued to all AIR stations, based on the advisories received from Union Ministry of Agriculture & Farmers Welfare and Indian Council of Agriculture Research. Stations also broadcast radio jingles and audio messages for the farming community, containing audio bytes of the Hon'ble Prime Minister's messages, on the COVID-19 safety measures and social distancing need for seasonal field activities.

2. Coverage of Bee Keeper Summit, (CIH), Medziphema, Nagaland

AIR stations covered the Bee Keeper Summit on 11.11.2021 organized by the Central Institute of Horticulture (CIH), Medziphema, Nagaland and inauguration of Farmer's Hostel by Hon'ble Min. of Agriculture and Farmers Welfare and Hon'ble MoS (Agriculture).

3. World Environment Day 2021 Coverage

All AIR stations broadcast the event held in connection with the World Environment Day, 5th June, 2021 at New Delhi and addressed by the Hon'ble Prime Minister Sh. Narendra Modi through Video Conferencing. Stations also covered the events held on the occasion in their respective regions and mounted programmes to create awareness about Climate Change and environment conservation.

4. Dedicated Weather Forecasts in the Programmes

All AIR stations broadcasting Farm & Home and Kisanvani programmes were advised to allocate dedicated time slots in their daily programmes, for extreme weather forecasts/climate change impacting agriculture productivity, livestock, farmers' health and safety. Programmes included updates on parameters like rainfall, temperatures, soil and air moisture, hot, dry, cold and wet spells, floods, lightening, thunderstorms, cyclones, hail, frost, droughts etc.

5. Coverage/Publicity to Gram Sabhas on Jal Jeevan Mission

On the occasion of Gandhi Jayanti, 2nd October, 2021, Hon'ble Prime Minister Sh. Narendra Modi, virtually addressed the nationwide Gram Sabhas on Jal Jeevan Mission and interacted with Pani Samitis/Gram Pradhans. All India Radio covered the event on its national network and provided due publicity to the theme by mounting programmes.

6. Stations mounted publicity to the address in National Conference on SOPs for Drone Applications in Agriculture (22.12.2021), by Union Agriculture Minister Shri Narendra Singh Tomar.

7. Publicity to Flagship Schemes/Special Programmes over the AIRNetwork

All AIR Stations broadcasting Farm & Home and Kisanvani programmes were advised to broadcast programmes in different formats about the various Central Sector Schemes of the Government for the benefit of the farming community. Some of the schemes highlighted by the stations are mentioned below:

i) Publicity to Pradhan Mantri Fasal Beema Yojana & Kisan Credit Card

All AIR stations were advised to mount suitable programmes and provide appropriate publicity to **Pradhan Mantri Fasal Beema Yojana & Kisan Credit Card** to mobilize farmers at the grass root level and create awareness about these Central Government schemes to further enhance their enrolment. All concerned AIR Stations broadcast jingles and audio messages forwarded by the Ministry of Agriculture & Farmers Welfare on the subject.

ii) Publicity to Minimum Support Prices to Rabi crops for Rabi Marketing Season 2022-2023.

Government Policy of Minimum Support Prices plays an important role in safeguarding farmers against the fluctuations in market price and ensuring stability of farmers' income. AIR Stations were advised to highlight the enhanced Minimum Support Prices for Rabi Crops announced by the Government for the marketing season 2021-2022, by broadcasting jingles, talks, interview, discussion, dial-in/dial-out, etc.

iii) Publicity to the Issue of Stubble Burning, post harvest management

Inefficient Post-harvest crop management practices like stubble burning, particularly during Kharif harvest season, is the leading cause of severe environment pollution in many states like Punjab, Haryana, Rajasthan, Uttar Pradesh and Delhi.

AIR stations spread across the country were advised to spread awareness about the issue

with special focus on various innovative technologies, alternate crop residue management practices, incentive schemes and also various punitive measures, launched by the central and state governments. Stations mounted intense publicity on the subject including broadcast of jingles and promos to create awareness amongst the farming community and all stakeholders.

iv) National Women Farmers Day/ Week

AIR stations broadcasting Farm & Home and Kisanvani programmes observe the National Women Farmers Day on 15th October each year. Stations invite progressive women farmers to the studios who share their success stories including those who are awarded at state and national levels. The entire week is observed as the National Women Farmers Week with interviews of women achievers in the agriculture sector including successful women agri-entrepreneurs.

ii) Coverage of Virtual release of installment of PM Kisan Scheme by Hon'ble PM: 14.05.2021

Hon'ble Prime Minister's address and proceedings of the virtual release event of the 'PM Kisan Scheme' benefitting farmers across the country, was covered over the national network by stations.

iii) Publicity to Agriculture Infrastructure Fund/ Organic Farming/ National Mission on Oil Palm (India)/ PM Kisan Scheme

Stations mounted publicity to the provisions of financial benefit available to the farming community through the various central sector schemes like PM Kisan Scheme, Agri-Infra Fund, Organic farming, National Mission on Palm Oil etc. Audio Promos provided by the Union Ministry of Agriculture & Farmers Welfare, were forwarded to stations for sustained awareness campaigns.

iv) Publicity to National Awards for Excellence in Agriculture

Instructions were issued to stations for mounting sustained microphone publicity to the various categories of National Awards for Excellence in Agriculture, announced by Indian Council of Agriculture Research.

v) Publicity to International Year of Millets-2023

Stations were instructed to prepare sustained publicity plans for creating awareness about International Year of Millets-2023 Declared by the United Nations. Stations mounted pre publicity campaigns on the subject for promoting wider usage and higher productivity of

Millet crops.

vi) Publicity to Natural Farming Conference on 16.12.2021

All 97 AIR stations broadcasting Kisanvani programmes mounted publicity of Natural Farming Conference, held on 16.12.2021 at Pre Gujarat Summit, Anand Gujarat (14th to 16th December, 2021) and the address by the Hon'ble Prime Minister Sh. Narendra Modi was covered live on the network.

All India Radio covered the event on its national network and provided due publicity on International Women's Day, 2022 by mounting programmes.

AIR covered the Conference of Community Based Organisation (CBBO) summit on 27.03.22 at Subhramanian Hall, NASC Complex under the chairmanship of Hon'ble Minister of Agriculture & Farmers Welfare.

13. Publicity to World Water Day on 22.03.2022

All AIR stations broadcasting Farm & Home, "Kisanvani" and "Kisan Ki Baat" programmes mounted publicity to World Water Day on 22.03.2022.

v. Health & Family welfare:

a. Women's Programmes:

Women's programmes of All India Radio cover subjects related to socio- economic development of women, health and family welfare, food and nutrition, scientific home management, women entrepreneurship, education including adult education, women empowerment, gender issues etc.

All India Radio broadcasts programmes in different formats for the welfare of the girlchild. Programmes aim at creating social awareness on the issues relating to female foeticide, gender discrimination, awareness about the rights and privileges of women. Traditional folk forms were also used to communicate with the rural audience. "Beti Bachao Beti Padhao" campaign continued in 2021-22 also.

Every year the International Women's day celebrated on 8th March is given wide publicity by AIR. This year also AIR stations highlighted the achievements of women in various sectors of society in their Women's Programme which is a special focus group program.

Hon'ble Supreme Court of India directions regarding gender including Transgender (TG) vide its judgement dated 15.04.2014 in the WP(C) NO. 400/2012 titled as National Legal Service Authority versus Union of India, have been regularly given stress in public awareness programmes.

AIR stations have been regularly advised to give due publicity to the laws, rules, regulation and guidelines related to the indecent Portrayal of Women in media and to sensitize the public through positive portrayal of women. In these programmes, information about the legal provisions and the remedies available under the existing laws and regulations on indecent portrayal of women were also disseminated.

Stations gave publicity to the laws, rules, regulation and guidelines related to the sexual crimes against women and broadcast programmes in different formats for creating awareness of the legal provisions and punishment for violation of such provisions as per the judgement of Delhi High Court.

Instructions were issued for creating awareness and publicizing the campaign on 'National Mission for Safety of women' which covered diverse issues related to women and the girl child.

Programme Heads were advised to keep special focus on programmes linked to women's rights and their safety on the lines of the recommendations received from National Human Rights Commission.

b. Health Programmes

Health programmes are part of regular broadcasts of All India Radio. These programmes are planned and broadcast as per the health requirements of the concerned area, potential out-break of seasonal diseases and as per the instructions / advice of Ministry of Health and Family Welfare and the Directorate General of All India Radio. Awareness about diseases, causes and prevention, available treatment, information on immunization, government facilities for treatment of different diseases, health related government schemes are the subject matter of health programmes.

Awareness about new advisories from Ministry of Health and Family Welfare were publicized among the masses about the Coronavirus. AIR had started generating awareness about the disease at the earliest from the Month of January, 2020 on regular basis.

Copyright free audio messages, related to vaccines and other measure to prevent COVID-19, produced by Asia Pacific Institute for broadcasting development in cooperation with WHO/ UNESCO were broadcast in the month of June 2021.

State wise advisories were issued in September 2021 to keep special focus on COVID-19 related awareness generation programmes on the recommendations of an Empowered Group-8 on COVID-19, Public Health Response under Ministry of Health and Family Welfare.

Ministry of Health and Family Welfare and Indian Council of Medical Research issued advisories on screening, diagnosis and management of mucormycosis (black fungus), on which general awareness was created among the masses through various available programme formats.

On the occasion of reaching a milestone of vaccination of 100 crore dose to the Indian citizens, the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare released a song, which was played on AIR platform in appropriate slots.

In addition, various awareness generation activities were also carried out on the occasion of 100 crore vaccine doses mark.

In view of the concerns regarding new COVID-19 variant-Omicron, necessary instructions were issued to all AIR stations to increase their focus on COVID related awareness programmes under their regular health programmes.

Government of India has launched the 'Ayushman Bharat' programme – the largest government funded health care programme on 23rd September, 2018. AIR stations were advised to broadcast programmes in different formats to provide wide publicity to the Flagship scheme - Ayushman Bharat.

Fit India Movement is a people driven movement envisioned by Hon'ble Prime Minister, which fundamentally aims at making fitness a way of life for all citizens of the country. Programme Heads of all AIR stations were advised to create a joint action plan with the media houses at national and regional level to create an impact about the Fit India Movement. Wide publicity was given to 'Fit India Freedom Run' - to keep oneself fit while maintaining social distancing.

Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports under the aegis the Fit India campaign developed fitness protocols for different age groups which were given wide publicity.

People were advised to practice yoga at home during the pandemic on the occasion of International Day of Yoga, 2021.

AIR with UNICEF spread the Message of Nutrition and programmes were broadcast on nutrition related themes during the National Nutrition Month in September.

Nutrition for women & children receives focus in general and special audience

programmes. Ministry of Women and Child Development celebrated 'Poshan Pakhwada' from 16th to 31st March 2021 under 'Poshan Abhiyan'. AIR stations helped generate awareness on the theme.

Wide publicity was also given to the advisory issued by Ministry of Health and Family Welfare on Electronic Nicotine Delivery Systems including e- cigarettes, Heat-not-Burn devices, Vape, E-Sheesha, E- Nicotine flavoured hookah and such products.

Awareness was generated on the Mental Healthcare Act and programmes were broadcast to sensitize people towards the special needs of persons going through depression.

As per the recommendations of the India Expert Advisory Group on Polio Eradication, the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare organized a nation-wide polio vaccination drive on 31st January, 2021, on the National Immunization Day (NID) or 'Polio Ravivar'. Stations covered the Nationwide Polio Vaccination campaign and organized Interviews, Dial-in, Dial out programmes and short features.

Yoga Break protocol, an initiative of Government of India, is a protocol consisting of very simple and useful yoga practices. General Awareness was created amongst general masses at large through various programme formats such as talks, interviews, dial- in/ dial-out, phone-in programmes related to health.

Other subjects covered in women's programme include topics like the right age of marriage, delaying the first child, spacing between children, maternal care, child survival, better communication between husband and wife, counselling regarding male child preference, adverse child sex ratio, medical termination of pregnancy, management of reproductive tract infections (RTIs) and sexually transmitted diseases (STDs), pre-natal diagnostic techniques (regulations and prevention of misuse) act- 1994, breast feeding, T.B., leprosy, Diabetes and reproductive child health etc.

c. Children's Programmes and coverage of issues specific to Child Welfare:

All AIR stations broadcast programmes for children on regular basis. These are programmes for children in the age group 5- 7 and 8 - 14 years. Programmes are also broadcast for rural children also. Programmes are weekly and include plays, short stories, features, choral singing, interviews, stories from epics etc.

The following themes are suitably covered in programmes:

1. Protection of rights of children and particularly protection of identity of children in need of care and protection of juveniles in conflict law.
2. Care and support to disabled children.

3. Care and support to children under difficult circumstances.
4. Equal status of girls.
5. Universal access to basic education to children and more attention to girl's education.
6. Providing safe and supportive environment to children.
7. Improvement in the economic condition of family and self-reliant society.
8. National and international cooperation for better future of the child.
9. Safe drinking water facility and sanitary means of excreta disposal.
10. Protection from vulnerability to Internet and online content.

International Day against Child Abuse and Illicit Trafficking observed every year, was covered on 26th June, 2021. Programme Heads of all AIR stations were advised to mount programmes on the subject. They were advised to provide widespread publicity to the POSCO (Amendment) Act 2019.

Programme Heads were directed to provide wide coverage/ publicity to the second phase of Intensified Mission Indradhanush (IMI 2.0). Instructions were issued to provide pre-launch publicity to a Pan India Campaign named 'Safe Neighbourhood for Child Safety'. The 'New Born care week' which is observed every year continued from 15th - 21st November, 2021 was covered.

AIR with the help of UNICEF spread the Message of Nutrition and programmes were broadcast on nutrition related themes during the National Nutrition Month in September, 2021. AIR programmers sensitizes about the programmes on Nutrition and Immunization through various webinars in which UNICEF helped the AIR through its resources.

vi. Music:

Since its inception, All India Radio has been rendering yeoman service in the propagation and preservation of Indian Music with its unfeigned commitment as a public service broadcaster.

Online Music gradation system for old application is open and station and recordings for CAB Audition.

The live broadcast of the 175th Saint Tyagaraja Aradhana Mahotsav was done by All India Radio. To mark the occasion, as done every year, the Thyagaraja Aradhana Music festival was broadcast from Thiruvaiyaru in the National Programme of Music on 22.01.2022 (Saturday) from 9.30 PM to 11.00 PM.

Also, on 'Pushya Bahula Panchami' i.e. the Punya Tithi of Saint Tyagaraja which falls on 22.01.2022 (Saturday) on the Morning from 8.30 AM onwards till end of the group rendering of the Kritis from Thiruvaiyaru on the National hook-up.

- ❖ AIR sports is engaged in planning and executing radio broadcast of various National and International sports events on the National Hook-Up of All India Radio. The work related to acquisition of Radio Broadcast Rights, coordinating with various Sports Federations/ Associations, various AIR Stations/Foreign broadcasters and other relevant entities etc. are performed by it for ensuring smooth broadcast of sports events on AIR. The screening and detailing of commentators for sports events are also carried out by AIR Sports.
- ❖ To keep pace with the changing times, AIR Sports broadcast sport events on digital platform of Prasar Bharati where rights were available. Further, to enhance its visibility, AIR Sports subject to rights, carried sports broadcasts on Prasar Bharati Sports YouTube channel which has received tremendous response from viewers.

2020 Summer Olympic Games:

AIR Sports broadcast the following programmes of the 2020 Summer Olympic Games held in Tokyo, Japan.

Pre-games programmes: These programmes were broadcast from AIR, Delhi and relayed by all capital AIR stations, FM Rainbow Network and other interested stations, alternately in Hindi and English on national hook-up as a build-up to the 2020 Tokyo Olympic Games.

Curtain Raiser: Curtain Raiser programme from 2230 to 2250 hrs. on 22nd July, 2021 by All AIR Capital Stations, FM Rainbow Network, DRM and other interested Stations. The regional versions of Curtain Raiser were also broadcast on 23rd July, 2021 by the non-Hindi AIR Capital stations.

Daily highlights: Capsules of the Daily highlights of the Games from 2230 hrs. to 2245 hrs. From 23rd July to 8th August, 2021 by all AIR capital stations, FM Rainbow Network, DRM and other interested Stations. The regional versions of Daily Highlights capsules were broadcast by the non - Hindi AIR Capital stations during the morning transmission on the same day and the same were relayed by the other interested AIR stations in their respective language zones.

Updates on FM Rainbow: Hourly updates on FM Rainbow network from 0715 hrs. to 1915 hrs, from 24th July to 7th August, 2022. Besides the above, news was broadcast on FM Gold and FM Rainbow channels breaking into their usual programmes whenever a medal was won by India.

Hockey Matches: AIR Sports broadcast off-tube commentary of identified Hockey matches of Tokyo 2020 Olympic Games from 24th July 2021 to 6th August 2021.

Badminton Matches: AIR Sports broadcast off-tube commentary of identified Badminton matches of Tokyo 2020 Olympic Games from 27th July 2021 to 2nd August 2021.

Cricket:

- ❖ ‘Stumped’ a weekly programme on Cricket, a coproduction of AIR, BBC and ABC was broadcast every Saturday at 1130 hours on the AIR FM Rainbow network.
- ❖ AIR Sports also broadcast ball-by-ball commentary of the following cricket events:
 1. Final Match of the World Test Championship 2021 played in England 18th to 22nd June 2021.
 2. India –England Cricket Series 2021 held in England from 12th August 2021 to 6th September, 2021.
 3. ICC Men’s T-20 World Cup 2021 played in UAE and Oman from 23rd October 2021 to 14th November, 2021

F. NEWS SERVICE OF AIR:

The News Services Division (NSD) of All India Radio disseminates news and news based programmes to listeners in India and abroad. It broadcasts 607 bulletins in 92 Languages/dialects every day, while adhering to the highest professional ethics and standards in Radio broadcasting. Using new technology, AIR News is now on website in English, Hindi, Urdu, Assamese, Dogri, Gujarati, Marathi, Rajasthani and Tamil languages, and also available on social media platforms.

i. Organisational Structure:

The News Services Division is headed by a Principal Director General/ Director General (News), who is one of the senior most officers of the Indian Information Service. The PDG/DG (NEWS) is assisted by a team of Additional Director Generals (News), Directors (News), Joint Directors (News), Deputy Directors (News), Assistant Directors (News), News Editors and Reporters.

The various operational sections of NSD Headquarters in Delhi include: General News Room; Hindi News Room; Regional News Unit Desk; External Services; Reporting Unit; Talks and Current Affairs Unit; Newsreel Unit; Indian Language Units; Reference, Policy, Planning & Development Unit; IT and Website Unit; Library and the Administrative Wing.

ii. Regional News Units:

The Regional News Units (RNUs) in various states are headed by officers of the rank of Joint Director or Deputy/Assistant Director and assisted by News Editors, Reporters and Newsreaders-Cum- Translators. There are 46 RNUs across the country.

All India Radio's 46 Regional News Units (RNUs) play a vital role in catering to the information needs of the people with a regional flavour and further their grassroots reach. RNUs broadcast bulletins and programmes in 77 regional languages/ dialects, making news region-specific and listener-friendly. Each state has at least one RNU and bigger states have up to four RNUs for effective coverage of events in the respective states. RNUs broadcast 479 bulletins every day for a total duration of nearly 40 hours that include National, Regional, External, DTH Services and FM Headlines.

These units also mount 1087 news-based programmes in a month for a total duration of nearly 157 hours besides broadcasting special programmes on occasions like Republic Day, Independence Day or any other occasions of National importance. They also broadcast special programmes when State Assemblies are in Session. FM headlines serve immediate needs of information savvy listeners in their daily busy schedule in cities and towns. At present, 257 headline bulletins in 17 languages are being broadcast by RNUs.

RNUs gave wide publicity to various social, economic and developmental schemes launched by the government in respective regional languages from time to time due to their grass root reach.

MODERNISATION OF RNUs

1. RNUs have implemented TBS (Talent Booking System) software introduced by Prasar Bharati for casual bookings and payments.
2. Some of the RNUs have introduced E-office to communicate with the Headquarters successfully at their end.
3. Automation of RNUs by using NETIA and Teleprompters to prepare and read bulletins
4. RNUs have introduced Centralised Account System, CAS, for budget grant and demand.

iii. EXTERNAL SERVICES DIVISION:

Radio plays a crucial role as an instrument of Foreign Policy and Public Diplomacy. Nations attach great importance to international broadcasting as a means of protecting their image and point of view to the world.

As part of British India, All India Radio entered the domain of external broadcast on 1st October, 1939 purely as a tool for propaganda for the Allies during the World War II. The first broadcast of All India Radio for the external audience was made in Pashto language to counter the German Radio Blitzkrieg in the then North West Frontier Province (NWFP) to supplement the efforts by the BBC in this part of the world. After India attained independence, External Services Division of All India Radio had to assume a new role as the voice of an emerging nation, an old civilization, a tool for diplomacy and also effective propaganda machinery at the time of different crises. Since then, the External Services Division has been functioning as a vital link between India and the rest of the world, especially with those countries where India's interests are intertwined because of presence of a large Indian Diaspora. External Services Division connects the Diaspora with their country of origin and its culture and heritage, giving them a feel of home away from home. Through its external broadcasts, AIR aims to keep the overseas listeners in touch with the ethos of India, here point of view on different issues, strides made by India in different fields including Science and Technology, India's democratic and secular traditions, its vibrant art, culture, economy, business and trade opportunities available in India, projecting India as an education, health care and tourist destination, India's commitment to universal Declaration of human rights, etc.

Role of External Services:

- External Outreach: India's perspective for the neighbourhood and the outside world.
 - Voice of India on the Global Platform since 1939.
 - Countering malicious and anti-India propaganda.
 - Engagement with Indian Diaspora.
 - New India: Narrating India's Growth Story:
- ❖ Strides made by India in various fields.
 - ❖ Business and trade opportunities.
 - ❖ India as education, health, tourist destination.
 - ❖ Vibrancy of our art, culture, music, literature, etc.

External Services Division was merged with News Services Division, All India Radio on 12.08.2021. After the merger, efforts were made to revitalize the External services broadcasts. As a result of these efforts, external services broadcasts in 17 languages (11 Foreign and 06 Indian Languages), namely: Arabic, Persian, Dari, Pashto, Baluchi, Swahili, Chinese, Burmese, French, Indonesia, Tibetan, Urdu, Seraiki, Sindhi, Punjabi, Maitri (Bangla) and Nepali. Transmission in 8 languages, viz. Arabic, Persian, Dari, Pashto, Baluchi, Chinese, Tibetan and Nepali were doubled. Services of Punjabi and Seraiki programmes are broadcast from AIR, Jalandhar while Maitree (Bangla) Service is broadcast from AIR, Kolkata. The services are broadcast on Short Wave radio frequencies and are also available in digital platform with live streaming on AIR World Service YouTube channel (<https://www.youtube.com/c/AIRWorldService>), NEWSONAIR App for android and iPhone, and DD Free Dish for the listeners worldwide. Details of external services division of all india radio going on air at present are given at **Annexure VIII**.

News Gathering Network:

The NSD has to ensure production of news and related services which adhere to certain standards in terms of timeliness and quality. It uses various sources for news gathering. A team of dynamic Reporters/Correspondents, covering a variety of beats, is available at NSD headquarters (HQs). Foreign correspondents also posted in Beijing, Dubai, Kathmandu, Colombo and Dhaka. Correspondents are also posted at the RNUs. Part-Time Correspondents (PTCs) in more than 550 districts of the country also aid in gathering news through their respective RNUs. Social media e.g. – verified Twitter handles, Facebook accounts of eminent personalities-political and others, is also tracked regularly and proves a

vital source of information for news production.

iv. REPORTING UNIT:

The Reporting Unit at Headquarters extensively covered developments, events, launches of the Government's Schemes, important Press Conferences, Rallies, Workshops, Seminars, Addressed by the President, Vice-President, Prime Minister, Union Ministers, visiting Chief Ministers, Foreign Dignitaries and other Important Personalities.

Reporting Unit, by being in constant touch with various Ministries and other Government Organisations, Constitutional and statutory bodies like Election Commission of India, Human Rights Commission, and PSUs, gathered News and related information for Spot News Coverage. Their meetings, programmes and press conferences were also covered.

It also provides stories for Pradeshik bulletins which are broadcast in Hindi. All the important developments relating to Delhi and NCR were covered for these bulletins exclusively. The Unit did stories on Mann Ki Baat every month.

iii. Talks and Current Affairs Programmes:

The Talks and Current Affairs (T&CA) Unit has been assigned to broadcast analytical news based programmes on various topics. The idea is to help listeners understand major new developments, put things into perspective and deal with a subject in detail. Various topics were discussed extensively in the daily and weekly programmes viz., *Spotlight*, *Corona Jagrukta Series*, *Surkhiyon Mein* and other *Current Affairs Programmes*. Besides, the T&CA Unit produces *Employment News* and *Rozgar Samachar Bulletins*.

Important programmes broadcast during the current financial year include discussion programmes on *State Legislative Assembly Election*, *Covid-19 Pandemic*, *India's Free Vaccination Programme*, *Prime Minister's addresses to the Nation*, *Mann Ki Baat*, *State Legislative Assembly Elections*, *Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav*, *Aatma Nirbhar Bharat Abhiyan*, *152nd Birth Anniversary Of Mahatma Gandhi*, *International Day Of Yoga*, *52nd Edition of IFFI*, *50th Year of Bangladesh Liberation War*, *Ideas that transformed India- 20 years of Good Governance*, *G20 And Cop 26* to name a few.

Government initiatives and achievements in various sectors, National Nutrition Mission, Pradhan Mantri Ayushman Bharat Health Infrastructure Mission, Farmers' Welfare, Interviews with Union Ministers, International Day of Yoga and Swachh Bharat Abhiyan

were covered. Ek Bharat Shrestha Bharat also covered extensively, Prime Minister's events and Cabinet Decisions were covered with special in-depth discussions. Interviews with Union Ministers and secretaries and senior Government officials were mounted. Special discussions were produced on Prime Minister's monthly broadcast to the nation "Mann Ki Baat".

All India Radio News has been at the forefront on raising awareness on COVID-19.

Among the citizens, since the first corona virus case was reported in India. Talks and Current Affairs Unit started a special public outreach program - '**Corona Jagrukta Series**' in March 2020. On 9th September, 2021 this outreach program completed its **500th** episode and the programme continues to make its impact in creating awareness on various issues concerning COVID-19 pandemic. It is a live phone-in program in which top medical experts from renowned hospitals answer to COVID-19 related queries of citizens. The program played a crucial role in generating awareness on COVID-19 infection.

iv. **REFERENCE AND PP&D:**

Reference and Policy, Planning & Development Unit (PP&D) provides prior information about various activities/ programmes of the government and political parties on a daily basis to various Units of NSD. The Unit deals with preparation of Media Actions Plans (MAPs) and Action Taken Reports (ATRs), compilation of various other reports, which include a monthly summary for the Cabinet and Quarterly Progress Reports on the programmes broadcast from NSD, AIR to disseminate the achievements, schemes and messages of the government. The Unit also deals with Scrutiny of applications for the Akashwani Annual Awards.

v. **IT & WEBSITE UNIT:**

24x7/365 operation website of AIR News provided round the clock updated news from various sector with its hallmark of ABC- Authenticity Balance and Credibility. In the year 2021, significant progress has been made towards a multilingual and redesigned website keeping in the mind expectations of audience. The NEWSONAIR website is now available in English, Hindi, Urdu, Assamese, Dogri, Gujarati, Marathi & Tamil. Rajasthani version of the website has been launched on 4th January 2022. Efforts are on to make it available in all the regional languages.

vi. ADMINISTRATION & BUDGET:

CVC guidelines are strictly followed in the posting of various staff to sensitive posts for transparency in the daily administration and accounts work. The file tracking system is in operation. 52 RTI applications and 3 First Appeals were received and replies were given within the prescribed time limit.

Grievance redressed mechanism has been set up in NSD Headquarters in accordance with the guidelines of Department of Administrative Reforms and Public Grievances. During the period, 49 Grievances have been received and they have been replied to/resolved timely. Regular status reports on disposal of grievances are being submitted to the Ministry of Information and Broadcasting and Prasar Bharati Secretariat.

The accounts of NSD were audited for the year 2011-12 to 2014-15 by DG (Audit) Central Expenditure.

The replies of all the audit objections have been furnished. Except 1 audit objections, all Paras have been settled by DG (Audit), Central Expenditure, Government of India. Rest of the Paras will be settled in the next audit.

In line with the green initiatives of the Centre and its vision on Electric Mobility, All India Radio has shifted its entire fleet to Electric vehicles for all its transportation needs. Chief Executive Officer of Prasar Bharati Sh. Shashi Shekhar Vempati and Director General of All India Radio Sh. N Venudhar Reddy flagged off a fleet of 26 Electric Vehicles at Akashvani Bhawan in New Delhi on 2nd December, 2021.

In what can be seen as a small but important contribution towards realising the environmental goals of India, this is the second largest fleet of electric vehicles to be deployed in Delhi.

vii. PERSONNEL AT NSD:

AT NSD HQs: News Services Division has a sanctioned strength of 459 posts. Out of this, 284 posts are lying vacant in various cadres of NSD. The multiple activities of NSD: AIR are however being managed by engaging contractual staff or casual assignees as per policy/guidelines issued by the Prasar Bharati Secretariat.

AT THE RNUs: Regional News Units have a total sanctioned strength of 97 Indian Information Service (IIS) officers in different grades, out of which 18 posts are vacant.

ix. LIBRARY:

NSD also maintains a Library which has 15,940 books. The library subscribes to about 24 newspapers and 62 magazines. The library caters to the staff of NSD mainly news editors/ correspondents etc., for news operations it is using the library software "E-Granthalaya" developed by NIC to maintain a repository of books.

x. Expansion & Innovation:

NSD: AIR undertakes thematic communication plans for major campaigns like, COVID19 Janandolan and Vaccination Programme, Independence Day, Ek Bharat Shreshtha Bharat, Rashtriya Eka Divas, IFFI 2021, Swachh Bharat Mission, Assembly and By-Elections, etc.

In addition to coverage through bulletins and news magazine programmes as well as talks and Current Affairs Programme, NSD, AIR has adopted a radio plus strategy. Campaigns are, thus, undertaken on several Social Media Platforms. All broadcast content is posted online. Web-only exclusive content is also uploaded. Graphics, Video, Audio and Interactive Content like quizzes are shared with dedicated and campaign-specific hash tags to increase visibility.

xi. Important coverage (1st April 2021 to 31st March, 2022):

a) Assembly & Local Body Elections

NSD: AIR extensively provided wide coverage of general election to the legislative assembly of five states and one UT including West Bengal, Tamil Nadu, Kerala and Puducherry as well as by-elections to local bodies of various States from Headquarters at Delhi and from Regional News Units located all over the country. News items with voice-casts and sound-bites covering the election process, including electioneering, polling and counting of votes along with the Declaration of results were put on air through the three major news bulletins each in English and Hindi broadcast from the News Services Division, New Delhi. In addition to the coverage, Discussion and News Magazine Programmes were mounted. Apart from this, other Indian languages and Regional News Bulletins also carried the elections news and launched special discussion programmes.

b) Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav

To commemorate the completion of 75 years of Independence of Nation on 15th August, 2022, the Government launched Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav (AKAM). NSD: AIR has mounted special programmes to celebrate the Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav. India@75 quiz is being conducted twice in a week in the news bulletins. Name of the winners are announced in the news next day and a certificate and memento is being given to the winner. Regional News Units are running AKAM quiz weekly in their respective regional bulletins and various programmes on the theme of 75 years of Independence. A Special Daily Programme, Azadi Ka Safar with Air News/Azadi Ka Safar Akashwani K Saath is being broadcast in all prime time bulletins. In addition to this, NSD also broadcasts Programmes like Azadi Ka Safar, Dharohar, Aparajita, Nishan, Azadi Ke Tarane and Unsung Heroes, as part of Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav celebrations.

c) India's participation in the Tokyo Olympics 2021

AIR News broadcast special reports on the profiles of India's prominent contenders at

the “Tokyo Olympics 2021”. Special discussions were held in the programme “Surkhiyon Mein” with sports personalities. An Olympics quiz was organised with AIR News daily in Sportscan programme in July 2021. Daily Sportscan with focus on Tokyo Olympics and India’s medal prospects was broadcast. After the spectacular performance of the Indian contingent, programmes and Talk Shows were held with the medalists. The RNUs also carried out the same exercise in their respective regions. Social Media Unit of NSD: AIR gave wide publicity using videos and hash tags.

d) Response to COVID-19 Pandemic

News Services Division of All India Radio and its 46 Regional News Units provided extensive coverage to create awareness on COVID-19 and various measures being undertaken by the government. Latest updates and daily briefings by the government authorities were prominently carried in News Bulletins, Special Programs and Social Media at Headquarters. Expert advices, live phone of experts in response to people’s queries, myth busters, fake news alerts, positive news, ground reports, vox-pop on how the citizens are utilizing time at home, celebrity appeals to maintain social distancing, hand sanitation and use of face masks and useful/important messages etc. were broadcast at regular intervals in main news bulletins, special programmes and social media at headquarters. Similarly, 46 Regional Units of All India Radio also carried the same messages in their bulletins and discussion programmes, giving prominence to local situation.

A LIST OF ACTIVITIES DURING COVID 19 INCLUDES-

- New COVID-19 awareness bulletins & programmes: special COVID-19 bulletins in English and Hindi- 30 minutes each in the morning, day and the evening (8-9 AM, 2-3 PM, 8-9 PM) broadcast by NSD: AIR with AIR news correspondents from headquarters and RNUs in the field along with the experts in the studio.
- Duration of hourly bulletins increased from 5 minutes to 10 minutes.
- Corona Jagrukta Series: Over 30 live phone-ins of 50 minutes duration each between medical experts and general public organized to raise awareness about COVID19 and dispel the myths.
- Infobytes- corona- Kya Kehte Hain Visheshagya: Daily Infographics with Sound Bites of experts on all social media platforms.
- Special discussion programs: More than 60 talk shows of over 50 hours duration organized to raise awareness.
- Expert speaks: Audio messages by prominent medical experts from AIIMS, Delhi in bulletins daily about dos and don’ts, need to stay at home during lockdown.
- Mythbusters: Audio messages by top physicians busting myths about COVID-19 with respect to nutrition and health.

- Fake News Alerts: News stories busting misinformation and fake news.
- COVID-19 case updates and scientific developments.
- Ground Reports: situation updates, availability of essential services, no need to panic, distribution of ration and food, community kitchensto feed needy and poor in States & UTs, relief camps for migrant workers, transport of food items and goods, sufficient supply ofmedicines, arrangements for PPEs, quarantine locations, contact tracing etc.
- Positive News: Exclusive Interviews with recovered patients, vox pop keeping happy, healthy, positive & engaged, family & friends support network, self-isolation & quarantine.
- Audio Promos: Audio spots on hand washing, social distancing, stay home- stay safe, direct messaging through audio spots for village pradhans and sarpanches on raising awareness, dos and don'ts and precautions with respect to migrant workers & those on quarantine.
- With the lockdown confining majority of the frontline news personnel of NSD and its 46 RNUs to their homes, the prevailing situation brought the best out of them. Extended work hours, work from home and restrictions on mobility did not bog down them. Serving citizens through news bulletins and discussion-based programmes preoccupied their minds, despite the difficulties faced by them.

- Sound bites of social influencers being used in every bulletin in respective languages.
- Special discussion organized on importance of COVID-19 JANANDOLAN by NSD, AIR and its 46 RNUs.
- Disseminated & posted on the Social Media- Twitter.

f) COVID-19 vaccination publicity

NSD: AIR and its 46 RNUs have been creating awareness on the Government of India's Free Vaccination Programme, through its Bulletins, News Magazine Programmes, Talk Shows and Social Media Platforms. The news content includes Daily Headline Stories on the progress of the vaccination drive, Public Service Message (broadcast at the start of each bulletin) urging listeners to get vaccinated and also encourage public to get inoculated, and highlighting the benefits of Made-In-India Vaccines, Addressing vaccine hesitancy and busting myths on the efficacy and safety of the vaccines, through discussions and talk shows with doctors and clinicians from India's premier medical institutions/hospitals.

g) 100 Crore Vaccine Dose Milestone

As India achieved a historic milestone of administering the 100 crore doses of COVID vaccine, NSD: AIR, its 46 RNUs and Social Media Platforms gave wide coverage to the statements made by the country's top leadership, led by the Prime Minister, Shri Narendra Modi, and views of Governors/CMs, Vaccinators, Frontline Workers and General Public in their bulletins, news magazine programmes talk shows and social media platforms. NSD: AIR and its 46 RNUs also broadcast sound-bites of the Prime Minister, Union Ministers, Governors, State Ministers, Director AIIMS, Regional Directors of AIIMS, Scientists,

Experts, Beneficiaries and Frontline Workers in all prime time bulletins and social media platforms.

h) Coverage of Parliament Sessions

Wide coverage was given to the Winter and Budget Sessions of Parliament. Prominent coverage was also accorded to the President's Address to the Joint Sitting of Parliament and Union Budget 2022-2023.

i) Ideas that transformed India-20 years of Good Governance

Under the dynamic leadership of Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi, the vision of new India is taking shape with the nation making tremendous progress in all areas. In order to highlight the achievements, NSD: AIR mounted a 21-day special campaign under which theme based stories/ special programmes on various themes were broadcast from 17th September, 2021 onwards. News stories and/or voice casts on the specific theme were broadcast in primetime bulletins and news-based programmes- Aaj Savere and Parikrama. 4 themes were constant - *Janbhagidari/Sabkasaath Sabkavikas, Sabkavikas, Sabkaprayas/ Use of Technology/ Flexibility* - which were reflected in the narrative on 20 years of Sushashan. A special programme titled, "Karmyogi Narendra Modi" on life and times of Prime Minister Narendra Modi was broadcast on 17th September, 2021 by NSD: AIR and AIR Kendra's In Regional Languages/Dialects.

j) Pariksha Pe Charcha 2022

NSD: AIR and its 46 RNUs give a wide coverage to the Prime Minister's Pariksha Pe Charcha 2022. Promo spots on the annual interaction among the Prime Minister, Students and Teachers were broadcast in prime time bulletins and news magazine programme. Special series "Pariksha Pe Charcha- 2022" in which sound bites of students were aired in bulletins and video testimonials of the students sharing their experiences of Pariksha Pe Charcha- 2021 were displayed on social media platforms.

k) IFFI 2021

AIR NEWS accorded extensive coverage to IFFI - 2021. Ground reports from the AIR special correspondent based in Panaji and IFFI Desk at NSD HQs were broadcast in bulletins and news magazine programmes as well as amplified through social media platforms with a dedicated hashtags -#iffi52. Special talk shows were also organised at NSD: AIR and its 46 RNUs.

l) Indian Toy fair 2021

NSD: AIR conducted spot news coverage of the events related to Indian toy fair- 2021 in news bulletins/news magazines programmes/socialmedia platforms in regional languages also. Bites and interviews of participants of the fair and eminent toymakers were carried in bulletins. The social media wing of NSD, AIR and RNUs gave wide publicity on Tweets and Facebook. Link of the newly launched website was published on all social media platforms. Special programmes and talk shows were conducted at the headquarters and regional levels as well, including expert discussions and interviews on the related theme.

m) Aatmanirbar Bharat Abhiyan

Prominent coverage was given to the Prime Minister's address to the nation, with a special focus on publicizing the salient features of Atma Nirbhar Bharat Abhiyan. This mission aimed at encouraging consumption and use of swadeshi goods and services to realize a self-sufficient India, especially during the COVID-19 pandemic. The salient features of the programme were given wide publicity in Bulletins, Talks Shows, Discussions and Social Media Platforms.

n) 152nd Birth Anniversary of Mahatma Gandhi

Effective publicity is being done at NSD and its 46 RNUs in regional languages for the 152nd Birth Anniversary of Mahatma Gandhi. Places of historical importance related to Mahatma Gandhi and his contribution covered and highlighted by NSD, AIR and RNUs in bulletins and or news based programmes daily during this period in their bulletins and or programmes.

Main News bulletins of English & Hindi News Room and at RNUS started with a quote of Mahatma Gandhi under the titled "Bapu Ki Baat". Main news bulletins of NSD and at RNUs closed with Bapu's favourite Bhajan "Vaisnav Jana To...." spot news coverage of all related events, especially on the eve and day of the anniversary was undertaken successfully.

o) Coverage of 7th International Yoga Day

NSD: AIR and its 46 RNUs mounted a special theme-based coverage of the events and activities related to the International Day of Yoga, IDY-2021, through its news bulletins, news magazine shows and discussion-based programmes in 92 languages/dialects.

News stories publicising IDY-2021 theme – "Yoga For Wellness" due to the COVID-19 pandemic, generating awareness about activities related to the main event held on 21st June,

2021 were broadcast. Prime Minister's address to the nation on IDY-2021 was relayed on the entire network of AIR. The main event was live streamed. Messages of the President of India, Vice President of India, Union/State/UT Ministers, key politicians and famous celebrities were carried in the bulletins. RNU correspondents filed ground reports all through the day on the major IDY-2021 events held. The Talk and Current Affairs unit of NSD Headquarters led the RNUs in organising talk shows and discussions on the health benefits of yoga, especially during the COVID-19 crisis. The discussions also highlighted yoga as India's cultural heritage gift to the world, notably at this time of the pandemic.

p) Poshan Abhiyaan

Interviews & Phone-In programmes were carried out in local languages with Anganwadi & Asha workers. The programmes focused on the height, weight, diet and vaccination / what to eat, mother and child health and Tandhuruost Balak. Programmes raising awareness about nutrition were broadcast. Special programmes were broadcast on Poshan Vatika & Nutri gardens highlighting the role of nutritional trees & medicinal plants. Programme yoga for nutrition made for specific groups Eg. School children, adolescent girls etc. NSD: AIR also carried out distribution of nutrition kits in Sukadi in Gujarat, Panjiri in Punjab, Sattu in Bihar, Chikki was distributed in 250 highburden districts. NSD also organized block wise community kitchens for children with severe undernourishment.

q) Mann Ki Baat

The Prime Minister's Mann Ki Baat address to the nation every month was covered in all major news bulletins, including regional languages bulletins. Live webcasting on NSD's website was also done. Special programme on the "Prime Minister's address to the nation in 'MANN KI BAAT' was also broadcast in the talks and Current Affairs slot. RNUs of NSD: AIR covered 'MANN KI BAAT' in its 488 bulletins, and 265 FM headlines in 77 languages and dialects. Also, RNUs gave wide publicity on their respective Social Media platforms by tweeting in their regional languages. Apart from the traditional broadcast, live webcasting, tweet and updates on social media platforms was also done for the PM's monthly address to the nation. Exclusive graphics and success stories based on examples cited by Hon'ble Prime Minister in his speech are broadcast on the same day.

Ground-level positive and inspiring stories were procured from RNUs for forthcoming episodes of the Prime Minister's monthly Radio broadcast.

r) Bangladesh Liberation War

AIR News accorded extensive coverage to the golden jubilee celebrations of Bangladesh Liberation Wars ground reports from the AIR special correspondent based in Dhaka and AIR news correspondent from NSD HQS

accompanying President on his three-day official visit to Bangladesh were broadcast in bulletins and news magazine programmes as well as amplified through Social Media platforms with a dedicated Hashtags - #VijayDiwas #MaitriDiwas #BijayDibos. Special talk shows were also organised at NSD: AIR and its 46 RNUS.

A special interview with Dr. Muntassir Mamoon, eminent historian and former Head of the 'Bangabandhu Chair' of Dhaka University on India and Bangladesh historical civilizational and cultural ties was also broadcast by NSD in March 2021.

s) Coverage of Cyclone & Flood

Prominent coverage about rescue and relief operations by the Central Government agencies, Indian Navy, Army, Air Force, Coast Guards, NDRF and state governments etc. On severe cyclonic storms which hit some states during the year 2021.

Extensive coverage including update on flood situation, update of weather information/prediction shared by Indian meteorological department, rescue and relief operations by various agencies during the flood was also adequately covered by NSD and RNUs.

t) Floods & Lightning

In view of the directions from the high level meeting of the empowered Group-8 about the situation of floods, lightening and seasonal vector borne diseases that frequent broadcasting of disaster warnings issued by the meteorological department and important precaution to be taken during such events, following actions were taken by NSD: AIR and RNUs especially those affected by floods and lightening.

- News stories related to natural disasters and their impact has been broadcast.
- Audio Spots on precautions to be taken during floods and lightening have been broadcast by RNUs especially in Assam, Bihar and Uttar Pradesh
- Flood situation reports and warnings have been highlighted with the inputs from the local met offices.
- NSD has broadcast sound-bites of NDMA and Met Office Experts on how to take precautionary measures
- RNUs have used these stories in their bulletins.
- Special interviews with Local Met Office and SDMA has been conducted and utilized by RNUs hit hard by these calamities.
- These elements have been amplified by our website and social media platforms

u) Independence Day 2021

Broadcast of News events related to Independence Day celebrations across the country and abroad by NSD and its RNUs. Special emphasis was given on the announcement by the Hon'ble Prime Minister – Atmanirbhar Bharat Campaign aimed at encouraging consumption and use of Swadeshi goods and services to realize a self-sufficient India, especially during the COVID- 19 pandemic. Ground reports on different themes broadcast in addition to Talk Shows on Independence Day. NSD broadcast of special programmes to mark the starting of 75th Year of Independence.

v) Ek Bharat Shreshtha Bharat

News Services Division (NSD: AIR) and its 46 Regional News Units (RNUs) gave wide coverage to events related to Ek Bharat Shreshtha Bharat (EBSB) and allied topics: National Integration, National Unity in bulletins, news magazine programmes, talk shows and through social media platforms. NSD undertook extensive social media dissemination on all platforms.

w) Coverage of Swachh Bharat Mission

Spot News Coverage of various activities relating to Swachh Bharat Mission including

Swachh Bharat Pakhwada of various ministries were made. Special programmes, talk shows were also conducted.

NSD: AIR, and its 46 RNUs covered 28 States and 08 Union Territories to publicise the achievements of the Government of India under PMJDY via primetime bulletins and news based programme- Aaj Savere and Parikrama. RNUs broadcast news stories and/or voice casts of PMJDY beneficiaries. AIR and RNUs organised talk shows with experts on the progress and success of the PMJDY. Social

media/ website provided pre publicity promo tweets, photos, news and sound-bites on its platforms. Common tagline and hash tag for all activities related to PMJDY were utilised at these platforms.

y) Important Visits and Meetings

Prominent coverage was given to the live events of Hon'ble President, Vice President and Prime Minister. The Hon'ble Prime Minister participated in several high profile meetings crucial to national foreign relations. For these, NSD broadcast regular news coverage including live inputs in bulletins. Live coverage on Youtube, Website and Facebook was also undertaken.

Coverage starts from pre-meeting curtain raisers, leading up to comprehensive reporting of all events and engagement in the schedule. Ground reports in world news, news magazine programmes, Aaj Savere and Parikrama, as well as thorough analysis in talks and discussion programmes also take place.

z) Ground Reports

In order to provide factual information, at the grass root level, about the implementation of various welfare schemes and programmes of the government, ground reports are being broadcast daily in all the major bulletins. The bites of welfare schemes' beneficiaries across the country were also included in the ground reports. All the 46 RNUs also broadcast ground reports in the respective regional languages. The beneficiaries of all the major flagship schemes of the government were interviewed and the voice bites of the beneficiaries were broadcast in the bulletins. The ground reports were shared on social media platforms, including the NSD website for wider reach.

aa) Khelo India Games

NSD: AIR and its 46 RNUs give a wide coverage to the Khelo India national winter games held in Gulmarg in the Union Territory of J&K. Ground reports from AIR, Srinagar Correspondent, sound bites of organisers and players/ winners were broadcast in prime time bulletins and news magazine programmes.

bb) Exclusive Interviews

NSD: AIR organised interviews with the High Commissioners and Ambassadors of several countries, including France, Australia, Poland, Sweden, Kazakhstan and Uzbekistan. The interviews focussed on discussing India's relations with these countries in a range of areas. These interviews were broadcast in the "World News" programme and "Spotlight" show of Talk & Current Affairs Unit.

cc) G20 and COP26

NSD: AIR accorded a special coverage of the Prime Minister address at the G20 Summit in Rome and COP26 Summit at Glasgow. Ground report from AIR special Correspondent accompanying the Prime Minister was broadcast in all bulletins from the NSD Headquarters and its 46 RNUs. Special discussions were also organised by the Talk & Current Affairs Unit of NSD and by its RNUs.

dd) SAMVIDHAN DIVAS

Constitution Day/ Samvidhan Diwas related activities were covered significantly in all bulletins and discussion based programmes with a special focus on Fundamental Duties and Rights of Citizen. RNUs also gave detailed coverage to the events highlighting significance of the Day. Social Media platforms also posted events related to the Day and carried statements of prominent government functionaries on the significance of the Day. Pledges on the Constitution Day were administered to the staff both at headquarters and RNUs.

G. AUDIENCE RESEARCH WING:

With the changing mass communication scenario, Audience Research has occupied the centre stage. World over, almost all the big media organizations have been doing in-house audience research in one form or the other or 'Market Research' in marketing parlance as no media organization can afford to put their scarce resource at stake without knowing the potential audience (consumers) and market for their media content. Besides, they are also subscribing to syndicated research done by the various media and market research organizations. The secret behind the success of private TV and Radio channels lies in their capability to feel the pulse of audience through continuous audience research and to design and modify the programme content including presentation accordingly.

All India Radio has been the pioneer in this field. It has a wide network of Audience Research Units across the country operational since 1946. It provides programme feedback to programme producers to plan, design, and modify the programmes according to the needs, tastes, and aspiration of the target audience. Apart from this, programme ratings/listenership data are provided to sponsors, advertisers, and marketers to fulfill their commercial objectives. Audience Research Unit also functions as data bank and reference section for the organization. All India Radio has been the pioneer in this field. It has a wide network of Audience Research Units across the country operational since 1946. It provides programme feedback to programme producers to plan, design, and modify the programmes according to the needs, tastes, and aspiration of the target audience. Apart from this, programme ratings/ listenership data are provided to sponsors, advertisers, and marketers to fulfill their commercial objectives. Audience Research Unit also functions as data bank and reference section for the organization.

H. SALES INFRASTRUCTURE OF AIR:

The Sales infrastructure of the AIR comprises of the Sales Divisions (erstwhile CRDs), Sales Centers (erstwhile CBS centers) and the CBU(erstwhile CSU). The four Sales Divisions are situated at Delhi, Mumbai, Bengaluru and Kolkata. The Sales Center, Delhi is part of the Sales Division, Delhi. The Central Billing Unit (erstwhile CSU) is situated at Mumbai. CBU/CSU is primarily responsible for the execution and billing of the pan India campaigns of the AIR. In addition to the above it also maintains all the records pertaining to the Registered and Accredited Agencies. The Pan India Sales Center network of AIR is as follows:

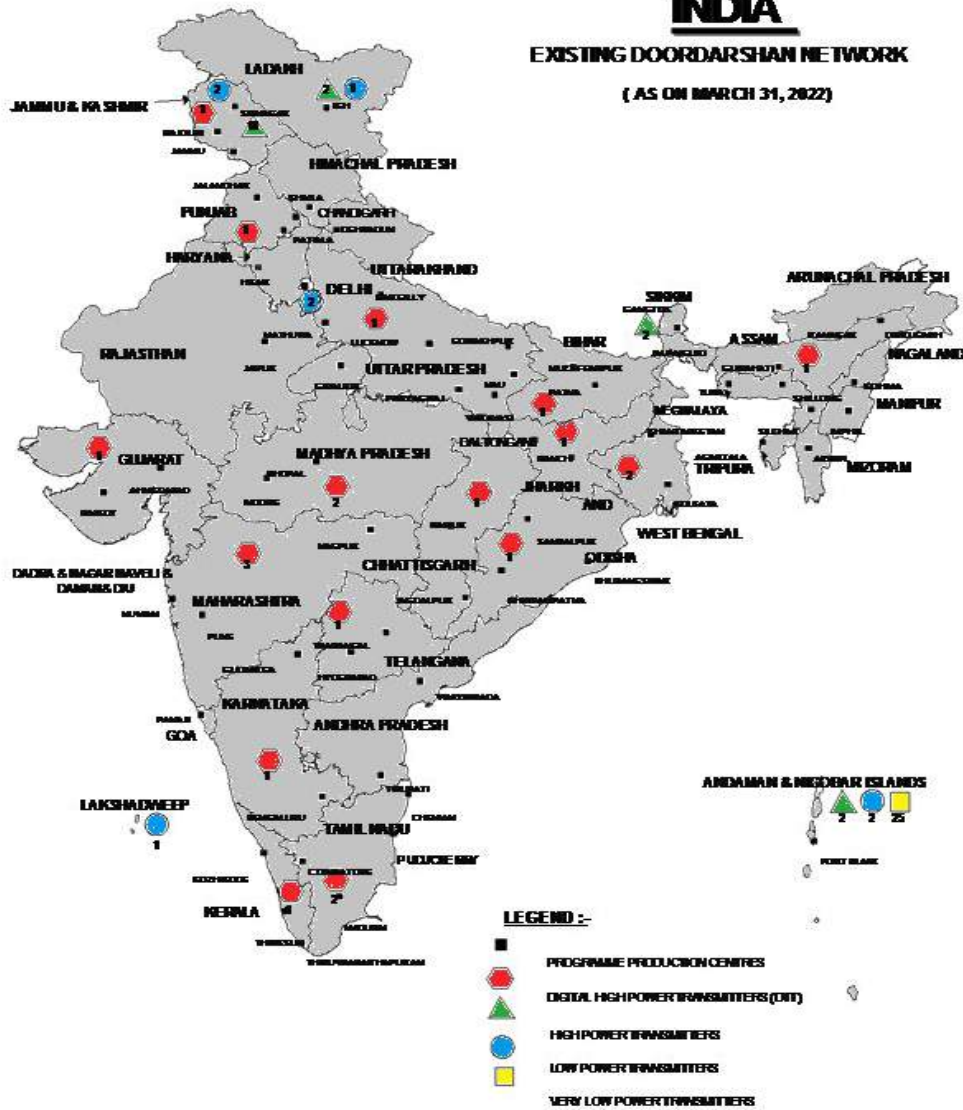

DOORDARSHAN

A. Introduction

From an experimental service at Delhi in September 1959, Doordarshan over the years has grown to become one of the leading TV organizations of the world. Doordarshan has a vast network of 66 Studio centres and 338 terrestrial transmitters of varying power spread across the length & breadth of the country. In addition, Doordarshan is providing free-to-air DTH service. For catering to the need of in-house Programme production, there are 66 Studio centres in the country. These include 21 major Studio centres at state capitals, and 45 other Studio centres located at various places in the country. State-wise list of Studio centres is given at **Annexure-I**.

In view of modern broadcasting trends, Analog Terrestrial Transmitters are being phased out, accordingly number of Terrestrial Transmitters in Doordarshan Network has reduced to 78 (as on 31.03.2022). State-wise no. of transmitters is given at **Annexure II**.

For satellite communication, Doordarshan has adopted DVB-S and DVB-S2 standards with MPEG-2 and MPEG-4 compression technologies. Doordarshan is presently operating 36 Satellite channels. Details are given at **Annexure III**.

B. Organizational Structure:

Doordarshan is headed by a Director General who is assisted by Additional Director Generals in Programme, Administration and Finance Wings; and an Engineer-in-Chief in the Engineering Wing. News Wing is headed by a Director General (News).

Director General, Doordarshan, is responsible for policy formulation, planning and development, infrastructure and technology up gradation, budgetary planning and control, human resource management; overseeing operations and maintenance activities, etc.

C. Present Technical Infrastructure

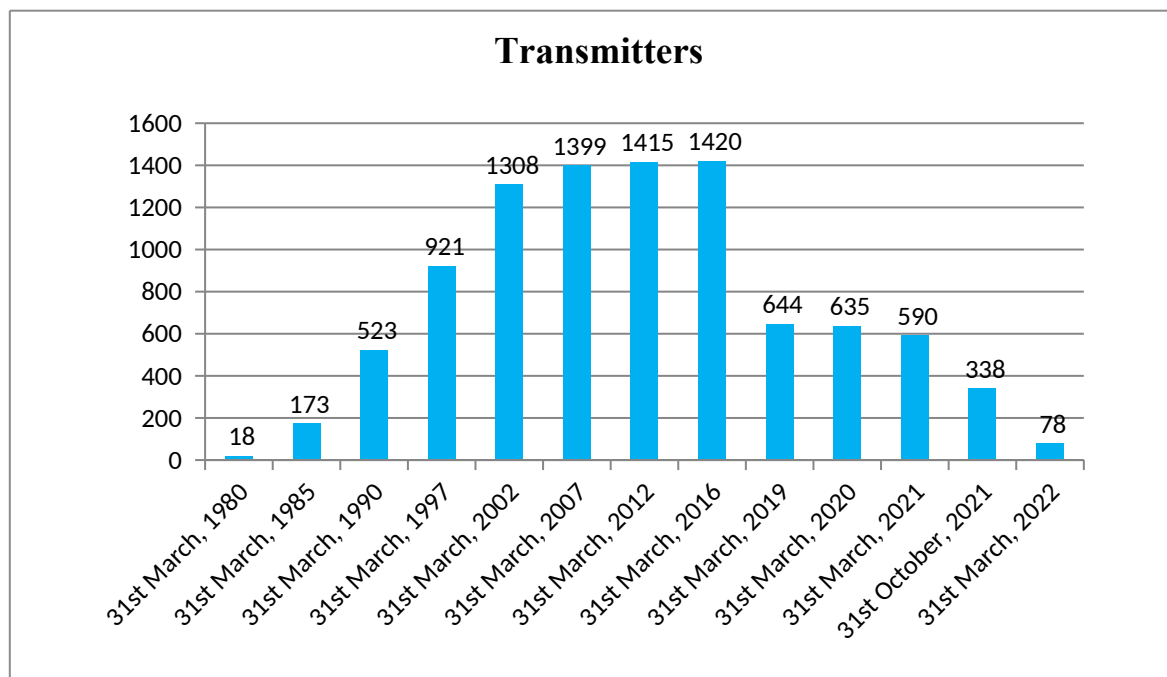
Major Technological Upgradations

Over the years, Doordarshan has not only expanded its network throughout length and breadth of the country but also inducted new technological developments in the field of TV broadcasting from time to time through its various Plan schemes. Out of the 66 Studio Centres, 62 have already been made fully digital. The remaining 4 Studio Centres are Analog. Growth of DD network over the years is shown below:

1. Present Technical Infrastructure

In view of modern broadcasting trends, the Analog Terrestrial TV (ATT) Transmitters carrying only one channel have lost their relevance. The signals of “DD FreeDish” can be received in the country with the help of small sized low cost dish receive units. An Inter Disciplinary Committee (IDC) was set up in 2017 to review the continuation of Analog Terrestrial Transmitters. As per the recommendation of IDC and approval of Prasar Bharati Board, the obsolete Analog Terrestrial Transmitters are being phased out. Accordingly the number of Terrestrial Transmitters in Doordarshan Network has reduced from 338 (as on 31.10.2021) to 78 (as on 31.03.2022) thereby 260 nos. of ATTs have been closed during the same period. State-wise list of no. of operational transmitters as on 31.03.2022 is enclosed as **Annexure-II**.

D. Significant developmental activities during this year are:

- HD upgradation of existing Studios of DD News, DDK Delhi & CPC Delhi to enhance the studio production capability in High Definition.
- Creation of separate PCR of Presentation Studio for DD News for better utilization of the studio.

- c. DD DTH Expansion by Upgradation of existing 2 Compression chain. Capacity of DD DTH Platform has been expanded from 112 SDTV Channels to 128 SDTV Channels.
- d. HPT at Himbotingla (Ladakh) has been commissioned for better terrestrial coverage in border areas.

Major projects under implementation which are likely to be completed during current financial year:

- a. Provision of Automated Playout Facility for DD Bharati Channel. This system will facilitate HD capable automation and seamless 24X7 transmission.
- b. Provision of High Definition Multi-camera Mobile Production Facility (EFP Van) for DDK Dehradun. The High definition Multi-camera Mobile Production Facility (EFP Van) facilitates enhancement in Production quality of OB Programmes including VIP coverages / live telecast / recordings.
- c. HPTs at Patnitop & Green Ridge (J&K) have been installed for better terrestrial coverage in border areas.
- d. Setting up of HPTs (two nos.) at Rajouri (J&K) for better terrestrial coverage in border areas.
- e. Modernization of Earth station at 11 locations (Kolkata, Bhubaneswar, Lucknow, Ahmedabad, Chennai, Thiruvananthapuram, Bhopal, Jaipur, Jalandhar, Jammu & Shimla) to make them spectrum efficient. All equipment except OFC Link & Uplink PDA have been provided. Existing services of Earth Stations at Ahmedabad, Chennai, Thiruvananthapuram & Bhopal have been migrated to upgraded earth stations.
- f. Distribution of DTH receive sets (1,20,000 nos) in Remote, Tribal & LWE areas.
- g. Provision of File based workflow facility at DDK Hyderabad.
- h. Provision of Automated News Production System at News HQ, Delhi.
- i. Tower strengthening work at Gangtok (Sikkim).
- j. As part of Modernization, Augmentation & Replacement of Satellite Broadcast equipment, the Earth station at Shimla and Jaipur have been upgraded to spectrum efficient system. The services of Earth Stations have been migrated to new setup.
- k. Post Production facility at Raipur, Ranchi and Dehradun supplied as part of Expansion of TV Channels. It will enhance post production capabilities for 24 hours Channels.

2.2 Following Projects are under various stages of implementation:

- a) 24x7 Integrated News Production Facilities at DDK Shimla.
- b) Provision of Automation Play-out Facility at DD India.
- c) Setting up of HPTs at Patnitop, Green Ridge & 2 no. of HPTs at Rajouri (J&K) for better terrestrial coverage in border areas.

- d) SITC of Uplink Antenna System at 7 locations (Kolkata, Bhubaneswar, Lucknow, Ahmedabad, Chennai, Thiruvananthapuram and Chandigarh) for better efficiency & reliability.
- e) Distribution of DTH receive sets (1,20,000 nos.) so that people in Remote, Tribal & LWE areas will be able to receive DD DTH Signals.
- f) Procurement of LTO for archiving the content at DDK Raipur, Ranchi and Dehradun in Digital form.
- g) Upgradation of Earth Station Pitampura (C-Band) from 10 channels to 14 channels for better efficiency and reliability.
- h) As part of Modernisation and Digitalization of Studios, Procurement of 2 M/E HD Digital Production Switcher at 4 locations (Lucknow, Mumbai, Kolkata and Raipur) which will help production of programs in HD quality.
- i) End-to End File based Workflow facility at Hyderabad. It will help seamless transmission/recording without need of physical media.
- j) Procurement of Multi Camera Mobile Production facility (EFP van) for Dehradun. The High definition Multi-camera Mobile Production Facility (EFP Van) facilitates enhancement in Production quality of OB Programmes including VIP coverages / live telecast/ recordings.
- k) Tower Strengthening work at Gangtok for mounting DTT antenna in future which will help transmitting multiple channels and better transmission quality.

E. Free-to-air DTH “DD Free Dish”

Doordarshan launched its free-to-air DTH service “DD FreeDish” (Earlier DD Direct+) in December, 2004 with a bouquet of 33 TV channels. Capacity of DTH Platform was subsequently augmented to 59 TV channels. DTH signals can be received anywhere in the country (except Andaman & Nicobar Islands) with the help of small sized dish receive units. For A&N Islands, DTH service in C-band with a bouquet of 10 channels was started with effect from September, 2009. Upgradation of Doordarshan’s DTH Platform “DD FreeDish” from 59 to 104 channels completed in Dec, 2014 which was later increased to 112 SDTV Channels. Further upgradation of DD’s DTH platform up to 128 TV channels has been completed as part of approved 3-Years (2017-20) Extension Scheme of Doordarshan.

Presently free-to-air DTH Service of Prasar Bharati “DD FreeDish” is carrying more than 150 TV channels including 51 educational channels free of cost without any monthly subscription. List of DD Free Dish channels has been placed at **Annexure-V**.

Installation, testing and commissioning of iCAS developed by Ministry of Electronics & Information Technology in DD Free Dish DTH Platform has been completed. 10 Indian Set-

Top-Box manufacturers have been empanelled to sell/ distribute iCAS enabled DD Free Dish Set-Top-Boxes. Details are available on the website www.doordarshan.gov.in and www.prasarbharati.gov.in

F. Digitalization of Terrestrial Transmitters

As a part of 11th& 12th Plan projects, 63 DTT Transmitters were approved to be set up in different parts of the country in a phased manner. In the first phase, 19 DTT Transmitters one each at Delhi, Kolkata, Mumbai, Chennai, Patna, Ahmedabad, Raipur, Lucknow, Bhopal, Guwahati, Indore, Bengaluru, Jalandhar, Ranchi, Cuttack, Aurangabad (Mah.), Hyderabad, Thiruvananthapuram & Srinagar have been commissioned and are relaying 5 DD channels namely, DD National, DD News, DD Bharati, DD Retro & DD Kisan/Regional. Further expansion of digital transmitters is dependent upon availability of funds and sanction of scheme in future plans.

Second Digital Terrestrial TV Transmitter (DTT) has been commissioned at Delhi, Mumbai, Kolkata & Chennai.

Locations of 23 DTT Transmitters are given at **Annexure-IV**.

At present, though the service is primarily targeted for fixed/home televisions, it can also be received on android based OTG enabled portable/Mobile handsets by attaching DVB-T2 Dongles and Mobile apps for the purpose without any data charges in a limited area.

Prasar Bharati is currently exploring options based on Next Gen broadcasting techniques for seamless mobile reception before further expansion of DTT Network. Accordingly...

Prasar Bharati has entered into an Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with IIT Kanpur to develop Next Generation Broadcast solution/roadmap for Digital Terrestrial Broadcasting consistent with emerging standards such as 5G Broadcast.

Sanction for the Proof of Concept (PoC) of Next Gen Broadcasting has also been conveyed to IIT Kanpur. The PoC of Next Generation Broadcasting model is under process. Evaluation of this PoC will pave the way for selection of appropriate Next Generation Broadcast Technology and roadmap for digital broadcasting.

G. High Definition TV (HDTV)

Doordarshan's migration to HDTV started with a Pilot project on HDTV in 2007 and provided Electronic Field Production (EFP) Van and HDTV ENG Camcorders and Edit Suite at Delhi. The HD EFP van was used extensively during Commonwealth Games 2010.

During 11th Plan, Multi-camera HD studio production facilities have been set up & Multi-camera mobile facility for outdoor production equipped with 10 HD Cameras provided at Delhi & Mumbai. ENG based field production, Post-production and Preview facilities provided at 4 Metro cities besides setting up of Playout facility at Delhi. Multi-camera mobile facilities equipped with 8 HD Cameras for outdoor production have been provided at Chennai and Kolkata. One High Definition Channel i.e. DD National HD is available in terrestrial mode in Delhi, Mumbai Kolkata & Chennai by Digital Terrestrial TV Transmitter.

As part of 12th Plan schemes, Multi Camera Studio Production facilities in HDTV format has been setup at CPC, Delhi. Multi Camera Mobile Production facility in HDTV format has been provided at Delhi. HDTV Uplinking facility is available at DDK, Delhi.

Three HD Channels i.e. DD National HD, DD News HD & DD India HD are available in satellite mode, while DD National HD & DD News HD are available on DD DTH Platform.

As part of 3 Year (2017-20) Extension Scheme of Doordarshan, upgradation of Studio centre from SD to HD has been completed at DDK Delhi, DD News & CPC Delhi for migration of all 7 Channels originating from Delhi.

Human Resource Development

Due to COVID-19 pandemic, courses scheduled from April 2021 to October 2021 could not be conducted. However about 1533 Doordarshan Engineering officers have been provided training in 51 webinars conducted during April 2021 to March, 2022.

H. Coverage of Important Events

In spite of COVID-19 pandemic, more than 238 important events have been covered live by Doordarshan during April, 2021 to March, 2022 by using OB/ EFP Vans. Major events covered live by Doordarshan are given at **Annexure-VI**.

I. National/ International Channels:

DD National - the Flagship Channel

- DD National provides a healthy mix of entertainment, informative and educative content. In the satellite mode, it is available round the clock.
- DD National has covered various events from different parts of the country, especially those highlighting the government's flagship programmes with live broadcasts. Besides these, DD National also telecast events of national importance, programmes on

anniversaries of important personalities etc; during the period.

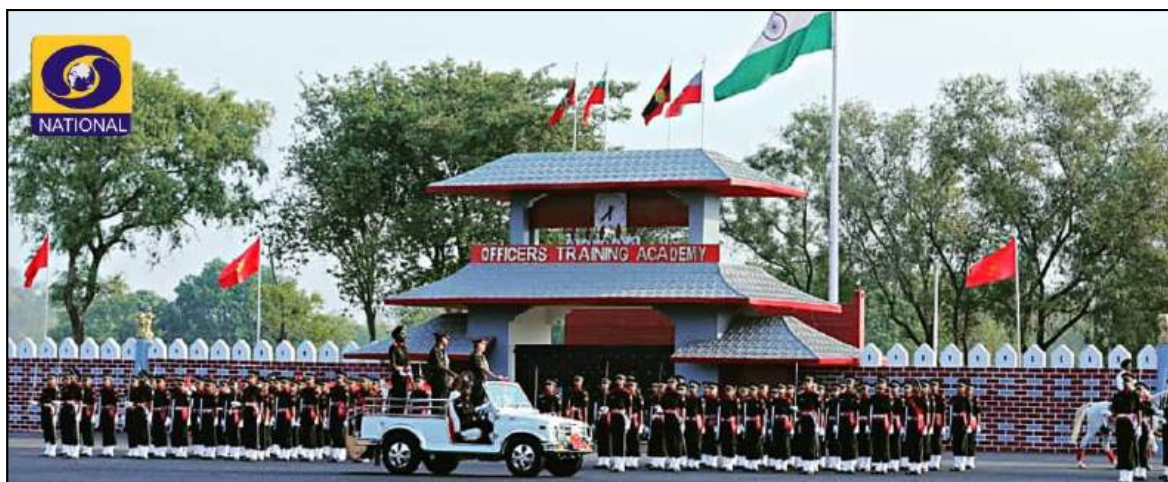

- DD across its network has mounted special campaigns on Azadi ka Amrit Mahotsav to commemorate 75 years of India's independence.



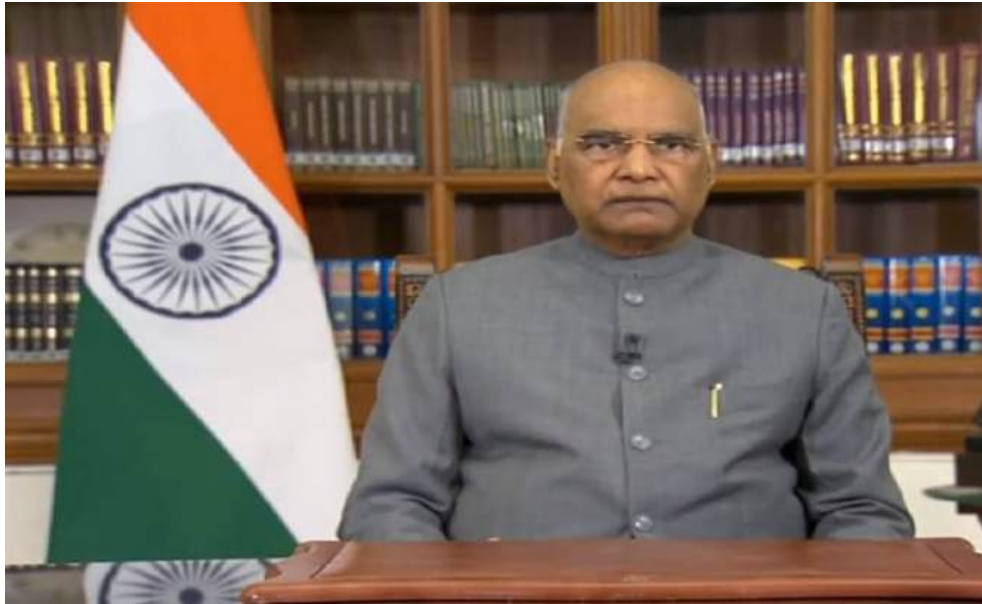

Content Sourcing

In 2021 Content Sourcing Section, DG: DD experienced a year of significance success and progress to showcase quality Contents to the viewers. Following programmes telecast during the period:-

Commissioning of Programme “Swaraj”. A special project of 75 episodes titled “Swaraj” has been awarded to commemorate 75 years of India’s Independence.

Out of 277 suo-moto proposals received under DAP, proposals of 4 production houses were shortlisted for commissioning.

Programmes 'Porus' and 'Bal Krishna' are acquired and being telecast on Doordarshan under Revenue Sharing Mode. The acquisition of another new programme 'Shaheedon Ki Gali (tentative title) is also in process.

Total 251 proposals are received and under process for acquisition of off the shelf contents under 'Policy Guidelines for acquisition of Licensed Ready-Made Audio-Visual Content'. These proposals are under scrutiny.

Production of 'Yoga Anthem' and new year eve programme 'Aum'. Programme 'AUM', comprising of soulful singing by legendary singer Sh.Kailash Kher, was commissioned for telecast on New Year Eve.

Telecast of Feature Films on Special Occasions

1. Hindi Feature Film “Babasaheb Ambedkar” on Birth anniversary of Dr. B. R. Ambedkar.
2. To commemorate 75th Independence Day of the Nation, 8 Hindi Feature Films on patriotic theme were telecast from 08.08.2021 to 15.08.2021. Five films namely Hamara Tiranga, Mangal Pandey “The’ Rising”, Sardar , Hindustan Ki Kasam, and Tiranga were telecast on DD National and three films namely Chapeker Brothers, Veer Savarkar and Krantiveer, were telecast on DD Retro Channel.
3. Two Patriotic Hindi Feature Films namely Raazi and Force-2 and five Documentaries namely 1857- The Beginning, Poorna Swaraj, India Wins Freedom, Merger of Princely States- A challenge to the Nation and Netaji were telecast on the occasion of Celebration of “Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav” (75th year of India’s Independence, between 28th august

2021 to 29th august 2021).

4. Film Adi Shankaracharya (With Hindi dubbed version) was telecast on DD national. The same was also telecast on DD Bharati in Sanskrit Language (with English Subtitles), and on DD Podhgai (with Tamil subtitles).
5. Hindi Feature Film 'Manikarnika' was telecast on birth anniversary of Rani Lakshmi Bai.
6. Two Patriotic Films namely 'Force -2' and 'Hamara Tiranga', and Six Documentaries namely 1857-The Beginning, Chandra Shekha Azaad, Pt. Ram Prasad Bismil, The Unknown Freedom Fighters, Ashfaq Ullah Khan, and a Song for Birsa, were telecast to commemorate the Republic Day 2022.

ii. DD News

DD News was launched as a separate channel on 3 November, 2003. It is a multi-lingual satellite news channel having footprint available across the country. DD News is currently producing news content in Hindi, Sanskrit and Sign languages. The channel does over 18 hours of LIVE transmission including telecast of more than 30 news bulletins in Hindi, Urdu and Sanskrit languages. Besides, this DD News has 31 Regional News Units, which are making bulletins in regional languages and are being telecast in respective Regional Kendras. DD News also makes bulletins for DD Urdu, DD Kisan and the regional GEC channels of DD Network in the States show.

The channel migrated to High Definition Platform in the month of October, 2020. DD News and the Regional News Units went out of their way to keep the public informed of every step taken by the Government and to clear any rumours and misconceptions/fake news that were being propagated by other platforms. DD News and its Regional News Units had to come up with innovative news broadcasting practices keeping in sync with the COVID-19 protocols to ensure safety of those involved in the news broadcasting operations.

News Gathering

- Own Correspondents in HQs and RNUs.
- Stringers and part-time correspondents of AIR
- Agencies (Reuters, ANI)
- International partners (e.g. other national broadcasters, Asia vision Network (AVN)/ ABU, FSN).

In DD News, news inputs are received from across the country, including remote areas, through the latest satellite-based technologies, together with DSNG Vans/ OB Vans, and through file internet/cellular mobile based technologies, such as TVU Backpacks and File Transfer Protocols (FTP). DD News collects majority of its news from the following sources:

- Correspondents are also regularly sent out from Delhi and RNUs to cover news events and developmental and human-interest stories in different parts of the country.
- DD News has been sending correspondents to cover VVIP visits abroad, launch of mega flagship programmes, General and State elections and such other major happenings.

Accomplishments

Restructuring the format and content of the channel is a significant and ongoing process at the DD News. Several new programmes on various issues including covid-19 have also been introduced in the recent past. Some of the main programmes being telecast are mentioned below:

- DD News Conclave, Desh ki baat- DD News ke Sath- is a series of seven Conclaves on identified themes hosted and telecast by DD News. The episodes were focused on- 'Changing Jammu & Kashmir and Ladakh' with participation of Hon'ble MoS PMO Dr. Jitendra Singh, Social Empowerment with participation of Hon'ble Social Justice and Empowerment Minister Dr. Virendra Kumar, Vishwa Guru Banta Bharat with participation of Hon'ble Minister for External Affairs, Dr. S. Jaishankar, Cooperative Federalism, Reimagining Disaster Management and Youth power - from Sports to Start ups with messages of Hon'ble MIB Anurag Thakur and Hon'ble Commerce Minister Piyush Goyal.
- Sewa Samarpan Sushashan Ke 20 Saal -A series of 20 episodes of programme Sewa Samarpan Sushashan Ke 20 Saal, showcased the theme of Vадnagar se Vishwamanch Tak, Ghar Ghar Jal, Gram Swaraj and Cooperatives, Ek Bharat Sreshtha Bharat, Swastha aur Sashakt Bharat, Swachhta aur Jalvayu Suraksha, Digital India, Aspirational Districts and Good Governance, Prosperity to Poor, North East Development, Jan Nayak Pradhan Sevak, Ease of Living, Smart Bante Shahar, Agriculture and Farmers Welfare, Changing J&K and Ladakh, Disaster Management, Foreign Policy, Yuva Shakti, Divyangjans and Sewa Samarpan ke 20 Saal were showcased.

- DD conclaves- DD News organized a total of eight DD conclaves during January to March 2022 which included seven on UP Assembly Election and one on Uttarakhand Assembly Election, namely 'Kya Bole UP' and 'Chunavi Rann Uttarakhand' respectively. The programme gave an open forum to all political parties' leaders to present their views on various issues. Hon'ble Chief Minister of UP Yogi Aditya Nath, Hon'ble Chief Minister of Uttarakhand Shri Pushkar Singh Dhami, Hon'ble Deputy CM of UP Shri Keshav Prasad Maurya, Hon'ble Union Ministers- Shri Rajnath Singh, Shri Nitin Gadkari, Shri Anurag Singh Thakur, Shri BK Verma, Shri Mukhtar Abbas Naqvi, Shri Gajendra Singh Shekhawat, Shri Prahlad Joshi, Shri Sanjay Balyan, Former CM of Uttarakhand Shri Ramesh Pokhriyal Nishank, Former CM of Uttarakhand and Congress leader Shri Harish Rawat, Samajwadi Party leader Shri Chandra Pal Singh Yadav, National Secretary of BSP Shri Satish Chandra Mishra, Kisan Leader Shri Rakesh Tikait and other prominent leaders participated in conclaves at Lucknow, Dehradun, Meerut, Bareilly, Jhansi, Prayagraj, Gorakhpur and Varanasi.
- DD Conclave : Budget 2022- DD News organized a conclave on Union Budget 2022 in Chennai to highlight the announcement and vision of budget 2022. Hon'ble Union Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman, Hon'ble Union Minister Anurag Singh Thakur and Hon'ble MoS for Information and Broadcasting Dr. L Murugan participated in the programme.

Technical Infrastructure

The 24x7 DD News & DD India channel have, at Delhi, its national newsroom and four studios. The newsroom works round the clock. Newsroom operations have been upgraded with the state of the art Quintal Automation System and Servers having non-linear video edit features at the Editors’ Desks. DD News has been launched in High Definition format also from 3rd December, 2018. For satellite based news gathering from different parts of the country, there are 17 DSNG vans stationed in different States which have been converted to High Definition. Over and above, mobile connectivity based High Definition backpack equipment are deployed in places when / where DSNG vans are not available or cannot be deployed.

DD News shares, free of cost and without logo, feed on major happenings and exclusive overages, whenever it is felt that a social or public purpose is being served. Other channels also often patch to DD News for live coverages of major events, especially PM's events.

Regional News Units:

Recently the Regional News Unit at Chhattishgarh and Jharkhand has launched a weekly News Magazine in the local language- Chhattishgarhi and Santhali languages respectively. In the recently formed Union Territory of Jammu & Kashmir, two RNUs are functional at Jammu and Srinagar, whereas RNU Leh functions in the another UT of the region, Ladakh.

The RNUs now telecast 147 News Bulletins, besides Graphic Headlines and Current Affairs programmes in 22 languages/ dialects with a combined telecast time (News and current affairs) of more than 54 hours per day. The RNUs have vast network of over 800 Stringers for news gathering across the length and breadth of the Country.

To incentivize and encourage the Stringers to file more in-depth stories from the field, a Stringers' best story Award Scheme has been announced to confer awards to best performing Stringers on weekly and monthly basis initially and fortnightly and monthly basis since July, 2020.

75 years of India's Independence

As part of Azadi Ka Amrut Mahotsav all RNUs are providing prominent coverage of stories on Unsung Heroes, Champions of New India and other capsules on Azadi ka Amrut Mahotsav. Besides, each RNU produced a 30 minute programme on unsung heroes of Indian freedom struggle and associated iconic places in their respective States.

Prime Minister's Speeches:

All the major speeches made by the Prime Minister at various events are shown by the RNUs with translations in respective regional languages.

Modernization and Computerization: Under modernization plan DD News has done following activities during the period under report:-

- a. In August, 2018 all cameras in Studios were replaced with HD Cameras to enable DD News to move to HD telecast.
- b. New integrated News production system replacing the old one with higher facilities like additional video servers, edit suits storage, LTO based Archiving with HD ready capabilities has been installed & commissioned.
- c. At present we have **03** operational studios wired in HD configuration along with their PCR's. 01 more PCR is also wired in HD configuration but some more equipment are required to be commissioned to make it fully functional.
- d. Hiring of 17 Nos. of DSNGs capable of transmitting signals in HD, the HD DSNGs are being made operational one after the other. First such HD DSNG arrived in DD News in March, 2019.
- e. Prime time Bulletins of DD News, Special Live programs and many other regular programmes are being telecast from a brand-new State-of-the-Art Video Wall Set with graphics and info graphics going in the backdrop.

iii. DD India

- DD India is a free to air satellite channel that is operational on a 24x7 mode. The channel was launched on 14 March 1995 as DD International. It has been rebranded twice in the past, first as DD World in 2000 and again as DD India in 2002. DD India and DD News channels were completely bifurcated into separate English and Hindi channels in the month of February, 2021.
- After March, 2019 DD India was recognized as English News Channel by BARC. The idea of English News channel is to cater to the International audience as well as domestic viewers of non-Hindi speaking regions of the Country. The channel endeavors to represent India through its content portraying India's emerging economic power, its cultural values, its glorious heritage and its dynamic youth power.

- The DD India Channel has presence on social media, which includes a Face book page, Twitter handles English and a YouTube channel along with Instagram page. The DD India Face book page has 14,398 followers.

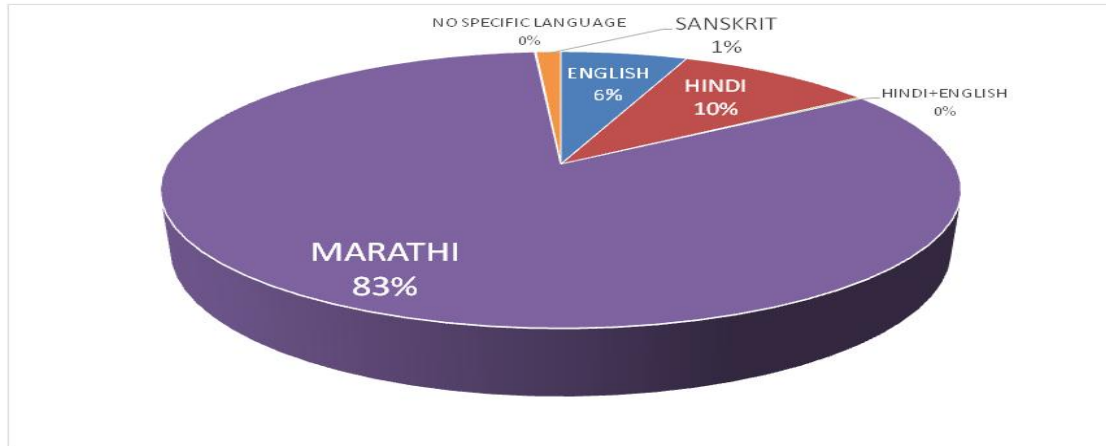

Social media:- support like WEBSITE, YOU TUBE, TWITTER and FACE BOOK is also used as tools for publicity besides sending programme details for publishing in the Newspapers. Displaying Hoardings in & around DD Building Premises. DD Punjabi is also using Cross Channel Publicity.

The Kendra put out seven daily live news bulletins in the regional language Punjabi. The main bulletins are 08.00hrs, 10.00hrs, 13.00hrs, 17.00 hrs 18.30hrs, 21.30hrs and News headlines with graphics at 15.00hrs. It is also producing additional programmes on news based and current affairs like Khas Khabar Ik Nazar, Ajj Da Masla, Haftawaar Gatividhian Te Samikhya and Sargarmian providing a resume of the political and developmental activities of the State of Punjab.

viii. DD Kashir

DD-Kashir as a separate Regional Language satellite channel was inaugurated on 06-06-2000. It has terrestrial support through high power transmitter (HPTs) located in the UT and is also on DTH platform of Doordarshan. The time-slot for Dogri Programme (Programmes from Jammu Region) has been increased from half an hour per day to 1 hour 30 min. per day and time slot for Ladakh region has also been increased from half an hour per to 1 hour per day. It has also increased the frequency of the Programme on local Folk Theatre/Art, namely “Band-e-Pathar”, to promote the dying Art/Culture of the region as well as the telecast of Kashmiri Mushaira from quarterly to monthly basis.

On completion of commissioning of 104 programmes under reconsideration scheme of DD-Kashir, 48 programmes are available for telecast of 241 episodes on DD-KASHIR Channel to showcase episodes the culture of Jammu & Kashmir region through Fiction & Non-Fiction programmes.

Five CPG programmes titled "Kashmirnama", "Dateline Kashmir", "Kashmir Now", "Pakistan Reporter", "Sharhad Ke Do Rukh" are being telecast on DD Kashir Channel to counter the of Cross Boarder propaganda.

DD Kashir has also started a new Musical programme, “Kala Aur Kalakar” for singer and another one “Ubhartey Gulokar”, in collaboration with Academy of Art and Culture, Govt. of J&K, to promote young budding artists of the region.

DD Kashir is producing a programme “Awaam Ki Awaaz”, address to the people by Hon'ble Lt. Governor, UT of J&K every month, which is scheduled to telecast on every 3rd Sunday of

every month. DDK Srinagar is the first Kendra to produce such series in the line of “Mann Ki Baat”.

The frequency of the Programme on local Folk Theater/Art, namely "Band-e-Pathar" has been increased for telecast on DD-Kashir Channel

DD Kashir has produced a series of documentary on different and unexplored Tourist Spots of Kashmir Valley in collaboration with J&K Tourism Department.

DD Kashir has produced an event “AIR SHOW” organized by Indian Air Force and Govt. of UT of J&K over the famous Dal Lake of Srinagar.

The frequency of the telecast of Kashmiri Mushaira has also been increased from quarterly to monthly basis on DD-Kashir Channel.

DD-KASHIR has also started a new Musical programme, named as "Kala Aur Kalakar and another one "Ubhartey Gulokar", which is in collaboration with Academy of Art and Culture, Govt of J&K, to promote young budding artists of the region.

DDK Srinagar has also conducted audition process for Empanelment of Fresh Anchors for DD Kashir, to engage the unemployed youth talent of J&K with this organization.

The "Good Morning J&K" is a very popular and channel-driven show of DD-KASHIR and appreciated by the audience.

DD-Kashir Channel has increased the time-slot for Dogri Programme (Programmes from Jammu Region) from half an hour per day to 1 hour 30 min per day. Accordingly, time slot for Ladakh region has also been increased from half an hour per day to 1 hour per day.

DDK Srinagar has also produced the event "Kargil Vijay Divas", celebrated at Kargil War Memorial by Indian Army.

DD-Kashir has also covered and telecast Major/VVIP events LIVE in connection with the visits of Hon'ble President of India, Hon'ble Union Home Minister, Hon'ble Finance Minister, Hon'ble Minister of I&B, so on and so forth, to the J&K.

ix. DD Odia

DD-Odia started functioning from 2nd, October, 1993 as DD-5. It was made a 24-hour channel on 01st, April, 2001. The Channel has a programme-mix of News, Agriculture, health, literary works of eminent writers of the State, folk music and dance, art and craft, tourism and festivals. DD-Odia provides Satellite support to DDK, Sambalpur and DDK, Bhawanipatna six days a week with three hours of programmes to each Kendra.

During FY 2021-22 some important programmes telecasts on DD-Odia are : Car Festival of Lord Jagannath from Puri, Sital Sasthi (Sacred Marriage Ceremony of Lord Shiva & Devi

Parvati) from Sambalpur, Parbana Bela (Celebration of Dussehra in Twin City of Cuttack & Bhubaneswar along with different parts of Odisha), Dance & Music Festivals organised annually in Odisha like Konark Festival, Mukteswar Dance Festival, Raja Rani Music Festival, Dhauli-Kalinga Mahotsava etc.

x. DD Malayalam

DD Malayalam from its inception in 1985 has made its presence felt across the length and breadth of the country. The Kendra has programme production facilities at Thiruvananthapuram, Thrissur and Calicut. Kendra started a new News based programme “World This Week” from 06th June, 21. In April, 2021, kendra started a new serial “Om Namah Shivaya” and from September, 21 Live Music based Programme – Koottinoru Pattu started on Every Monday to Friday.

A New digital Earth Station was installed and commissioned on 28.12.2018. Kendra telecast programmes in Urdu, Tulu, Konkani, Kodava, English and Hindi. During the period DD Chandana has increased its social media activity on its different platforms. During 2021-22, DD Chandana introduced some new programmes ,as mentioned below:

xii. DD Assam

DD North-East was commissioned on 01-11-1990 and finally launched on 15th August, 1994. It became 24 hours channel from 27th December, 2000. DD NorthEast was renamed as DD Assam and formally launched by Hon'ble I&B Minister on 04th August, 2020.

During the period, DD Assam has mounted various programmes like programme on Mawlynnong village located in the East Khasi Hills of Meghalaya known as cleanest village in Asia, Ambubachi and Mahajobs'2021 held at Kamakkhya Temple, Guwahati. A special programme Swagatam, 2022 telecast on the eve of New Year Eve and Barshanta 2021 (Yearly News Round-up), produced and telecast Documentary on Doodh Nath Ashram and Sibsagarar Kriyar Itihas, Live telecast of inaugural ceremony in connection year long programme on 400th birth anniversary of Bir Lachit Borphukan and Pathar Nat Mela 2022. DD Assam telecast 19th Convocation of Tezpur University; attend by Hon'ble President of India Sri Ram Nath Kovind.

xiii. DD Arun Prabha

DD Arun Prabha originating from Doordarshan Kendra Itanagar was dedicated to the nation on 9th February 2019. The channel is equipped with state of the art facilities including a Digital Satellite News Gathering unit to provide live converges from remote areas for 24X7 telecast. The play out facility and the earth station established at DDK Itanagar ensure seamless transmission of DD Arunprabha.

The Channel USP is to attract young people of North East with contemporary entertainment source embedded with informative contents in their language/dialects for the benefits of Doordarshan viewers of the North East.

The channel has also produced some in-house programmes in different genres such as call of the wild, Cuisines of North East, STRUM: Bands of North East etc. DD is in the process of improving the content and look and feel of the channel in due course.

xiv. DD Rajasthan

DD: Rajasthan, a 24x7 Hindi Regional language Channel came into existence on 1st August, 2013 and started telecasting programmes from 15th August, 2013. It is available on DD Free dish of Doordarshan.

During the period 2021-22, Live U setup was made successfully operational for News. New Hardware for FTP has also been installed and put up in use with open source software file zilla for News. Doordarshan Kendra Jaipur has many popular, programmes in its itinerary, like morning show “Suprabhat Dharti Dhora Di” special programme series before invited audience “Mehfil”, Health Magazine “Swasthya Desh” etc. One of its weekly quiz programme “Prasnotary” has its mention in the LIMCA book of records, which is continuing for more than 25 years and has completed more than 800 episodes. Besides the above TV Report on Jaipur Literature Festival & Spl.Prog. on Rajasthan Diwas- Dhora walo Desh telecast in March, 2022.

xv. DD Bihar

DD-Bihar, the 24x7 Regional language Satellite Channel was launched on 01.05.2013. It continued expanding its horizon, across the country since its launch as a satellite channel. Most of the Programmes telecast are in the language of Hindi(60.0%) Bhojpuri(25.0%), Maithili(13.0%), and Urdu(2.0%). Shatabdi samaroah of Bihar Vidhansabha Bhawan was telecast from the Kendra during the period, besides programmes on Tilika Manjhi, Guru Nanak Jayanti- 2021, live telecast of passing out parade from officers training academy, Gaya and some Nepal centric programmes.

xvi. DD Uttar Pradesh

DD Uttar Pradesh, a 24x7 Regional language Channel came into existence on 16th August, 2013. This 24 hour channel covers genres like folk music, light music, play, talk show, quiz and other programmes. Inauguration of Doordarshan Gorakhpur Earth Station- 03.12.21. To follow COVID protocol activities in the month of April’21, May’21 and June’21, programmes related to pandemic were telecast to make people aware about it. Some important programmes telecast during the period:

xvii. DD Madhya Pradesh

DD MP Channel was launched on 20th October, 1992 as one hour regional Channel to promote the diverse and rich culture of Madhya Pradesh. Subsequently it was made 04 hour regional channel and on 25.06.2013 it was converted into a 24 hour regional language channel. New OB Van has been provided and New News Server installed for News during this period at the Kendra.

Some important programmes telecast during the period:

- Live telecast of Chhatisgarh Vidhan Sabha question hours.
- Telecast of programme on International Women's Day on 08th March, 2022.
- Coverage of different sports activities organized in the State by different Sports federation.
- Telecast of documentary based on the traditional craft of MP i.e. Bagh Print.

xviii. DD Chhattisgarh

DDK Raipur was commissioned in the year 1977. 24x7 transmission started with regional transmission of 3.00 pm to 7.00 pm and rest clean feed relay of DD News from 01st April, 2020. Later on this 24x7 transmission started with a loop play of 04 hours regional transmission for five times from 07th September, 2020. From 01.01.2022 transmission of DDK Raipur started only on Digital Terrestrial Transmission.

Regional News Unit, Raipur produced many stories on flagship programmes of Central Government, specially programmes being implemented in LWE/Maoist areas of the state. This not only helps to make people aware about the Government schemes and programmes, but also to rebuild confidence in government machinery among rural masses of these areas.

For maximum viewership of our bulletins and programmes, all News bulletins and programmes are uploaded in youtube, twitter and facebook.

During April,2021 to July,2021 most of the programmes telecast from the Kendra was based on the health issues pertaining to COVID-19.From August,2021 onward Kendra began to telecast other programmes for viewers such as Bastar Anchal Se, Special Programme:- Shakti Upasana Parva, Navratri, Special Programme:- Aazadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav, Surila Safar:- Lata Mangeshkar Ji Shradhanjali, Special Programme:-Parikarma (International Women's Day), Special Programme:-Holi Vishesh Karyakaram- Holi Faag Nritya Geet, Hamar Chhattisgarh:- Bastar Ka Laoh Shilp Kala.

xix. DD Uttarakhand

Doordarshan Kendra, Dehradun was started functioning on 12th August, 2001 as an interim setup at Tapovan, Dehradun in a building of State Govt. From 1st April, 2020 DD Uttarakhand started its 24x7 services. Most of the programmes telecast from this Kendra are in regional/local languages i.e. Garhwali, Kumauni, Jaunsari and Rang. Programme Hamri Maati Pani telecast from the Kendra is very popular among viewers, having high viewership on Youtube platform. During the period DD Uttarakhand you tube channel has more than 2.53 lakh subscribers.

In-House programmes produced by the Kendra during 2021-22:

xx. DD Jharkhand

Doordarshan Kendra, Ranchi was commissioned on 25th September'1984. On 2nd April'2002, the Kendra started telecasting Regional News as well as it became a regional unit with its coverage area extending to entire Jharkhand. From 1st April, 2020 DD Jharkhand started 24x7 transmissions.

Besides general programme DD Jharkhand produce and telecast tribal centric programme such as:-

- (a) Santhal Diary different development issues related to tribal are taken up, Documentary on legendary and patriotic tribal leaders such as, Birsa Munda, Sidho-Kanho, Tana Bhagat, Telanga Khariya Bhahid Poto, Budhu Bhagat and telecast of special programmes on Birsa Munda Jayanti, and Karma and Sarhul festival of the state during the period.
- (b) Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsava under which programmes on different issues have been telecast.
- (c) Special programmes on the occasion of Birth & Death anniversary of great personalities have been telecast.

K. State Network channels (24x7)

During COVID-19 pandemic, 8 Regional Channels (Non 24X7) i.e. DD Himachal Pradesh, DD Haryana, DD Goa, DD Mizoram, DD Tripura, DD Meghalaya, DD Manipur & DD Nagaland started 24x7 satellite service from DDKs - Shimla, Hisar, Panaji, Aizawl, Agartala, Shillong, Imphal & Kohima started functioning from the respective places.

i. DD Himachal

Doordarshan Kendra Shimla was commissioned on 7th June, 1995, The Kendra from the year 2014-15 is carrying regional programme every Monday to Saturday from 3:00 P.M. to 7:00 P.M. and on Sunday from 6:30 P.M. to 7:00 P.M. Transmission of DD-Shimla is now on Home Channel Stream available on DD Free Dish 24x7 and is known as DD Himachal.

Major Activities of the Kendra including major initiatives & achievements during the year 2021-22 are:- Special Cultural programme held at Gaiety Theatre, Shimla, Special Musical programmes “Himkalash” & “Himachalo-Ra-Nazara”, and Live telecast of function organized by HP Government at Peter Hoff, Shimla to mark the important landmark on becoming first state in the country where first dose of COVID-19 Vaccine has been administered to 100% eligible adult population, Live telecast of Inauguration Ceremony of OPDs at AIIMS Bilaspur, Himachal Pradesh, A series of programme titled “Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav” programme on Freedom Fighters, Live Telecast of Sujanpur Tihra, Hamirpur Holi Mahotsav & Cultural programme .

ii. DD Meghalaya

Doordarshan Kendra, Shillong was commissioned in the year 1993. The 1KW transmitter was then upgraded to 10KW transmitter for DD (National) which was commissioned into service on 09.02.2004. During the COVID19 pandemic in 2020 it was made 24x7 channel. Some important programmes telecast during the period are:

Chad Sukra, Behdienkhlam Festival, Jowai, Nongkrem Dance Festival, Smit, Wangala Dance, Cherry Blossom Festival, Winter Fest and Midnight Festival

iii. DD Goa

The Kendra was elevated to PGF status in June, 1990 with the telecast of local programmes for duration of 30 minutes from Monday to Friday. Duration of the Local transmission increased to 3 hours from October, 2014. Doordarshan Panaji started its full time transmission on Free Dish platform from 9th March 2019. It was also rechristened from DD Panaji to DD Goa.

It has complete digital setup for processing the base band signal for satellite communication and has been upgraded in the year 2013. It is now used for 24x7 DTH satellite transmission by uplinking DTH Todapur, Delhi.

Most of the programmes are telecast in Konkani and Marathi. The channel is also on Social media platform like Instagram and Facebook, These platforms are used widely to popularize in-house programmes. Youtube is also used as an alternative platform for live streaming of local content. From October 31, 2021 the terrestrial service has been discontinued.

The Regional News Unit (RNU) generates 3 regional news bulletin in Konkani at 1600 hrs, 1700 hrs and 1830 hrs daily from Monday to Sunday covering various news stories from North & South districts of Goa.

Kendra telecast 60th Liberation Day Celebration of Goa in December, 2021 besides telecasting Special feature on Goan Freedom Struggle to mark the occasion of Azadi Ka Amrut Mohatsav. DD Goa produced number of documentaries during the period .52nd International Film Festival Of India (IFFI) was covered live in November,21 .

iv. DD Haryana

DDK: Hissar came into existence on 01.11.2002. Initially 1.15 hours transmission was started from this Kendra which was gradually increased in phased manner. With effect from 02.04.2020, 24x7 hours transmission has been started from DD-Hisar, out of which 4 hours i.e. from 03.00 PM to 07.00 PM is in regional transmission and for the rest of time PBNS is linked. Channel name was changed from DD-Hisar to DD-Haryana w.e.f. 26.01.2021. The channel is on the platform of DD free Dish (DTH). X'mission-3pm to 7pm daily /after that DD News w.e.f. 14.01.2022. International Gita Mahotsav 2021, Saras Mela Kurukshetra, TV Report on Suraj Kund Mela 2022.

v. DD Nagaland

A regional language satellite channel launched on 15 August 1992, which became 24 hrs channel from the month of April, 2020 by utilizing the DD News/DD India streams(07:00 to 03:00 p.m), along with Local Transmission of 03:00 to 07:00 p.m. It is supported by Doordarshan studios in Kohima and Dimapur. It has entertainment serials, infotainment programmes, news & current affairs, social programmes and film programmes as its major content. The most important programme of the state, i.e; Inaugural function of Hornbill Festival at Naga Heritage Kisama was telecast live by DD Nagaland.

vi. DD Tripura

Inaugurated on 20th November 1992 with half an hour transmission. The channel started its 24 hrs. transmission from 21st January, 2021 and the nomenclature was changed to DD Tripura. The channel telecast its transmission in two languages namely Bengali and Kokborok in 60:40 ratio. Kendra telecast local news bulletin both in Bengali and Kokborok besides telecast of programmes on Health, festivals and anniversaries, Awareness programmes, skill development, Govt. Policy, sports, entertainment, agriculture etc;. LIVE coverage of the Hon'ble Prime Minister's visit to Tripura and coverage of the Visit of Hindi Parliamentary Committee members and representatives in Tripura was done during the period.

vii. DD Mizoram

DD Aizwal started functioning with local transmission for 01 hour from June, 1995. It was made 24x7 channel on 2nd April, 2020 and renamed as DD Mizoram with local content programme telecast of 09 hrs duration between 12:00 noon to 9:00PM, and the rest are filled up with programme patching to DD India/ Home Channel. DD Mizoram transmission signal is being carried out on terrestrial and satellite mode and the signal is also carried on DTH Platform for 24 x7.

Kendra live programmes are given live streaming on its you tube channel. All fresh programmes are given publicities through social media like whatsapp, Facebook, Tweeter, Instagram etc. with an attractive design of templates. Talent Booking System (TBS) for the channel has been introduced from April, 2021.

During these period DDK Aizawl in collaboration with Art & Culture Deptt Govt. of Mizoram managed to organize Virtual State Level Drama Competition 2021- 2022. Virtual Live telecast of Chapchar Kut Festival 2022, Winter Festival 2021, Assembly Session, Fire Prevention week 2022 Graced by Hon'ble Chief Minister.

viii. DD Manipur

The office cum studio complex of DDK, Imphal and DD-2 (Metro) channel was inaugurated on 23rd December, 1995. From April 2020, DD Manipur has been converted provisionally into 24×7 channels by utilizing the DD News/DD India streams .The channel has also strong presence on the social media platform with around 2.23 lakh (as on 09/03/2022) subscribers on You tube as on date, which is the highest among AIR & DD Kendras in the north-eastern region. Kendra has also received the Silver Award from YouTube in 2021(2.23 lakh subscribers as on 09/03/2022). Manipuri is the main language of telecast. 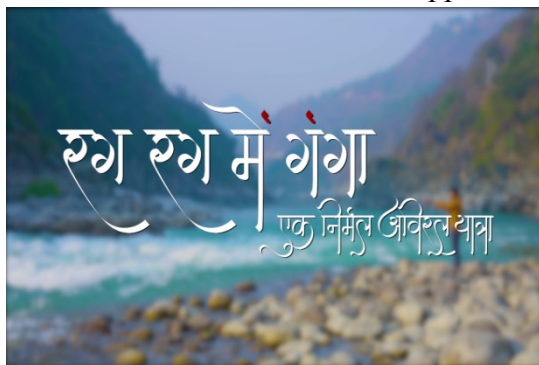

Media Publicity Division (MPD) is now Corporate Marketing Division of Prasar Bharati. It is a dynamic unit which undertakes Media and Publicity activities. All form of communication, advertising, outdoor publicity, Press Release, Booklets, Press Conferences etc. are undertaken for publicizing the activities and programmes of Prasar Bharati. Following major activities have been undertaken by the division in recent past.

- Total 34,232 Hours 34 min. of legacy content has been dubbed/digitized and stored in digital tapes up to 31st March 2022, out of which 1476 Hrs 12 mts. of content has been digitized during the period from 1st April 2021 to 31st March 2022.
- Till now 59,415 Nos. of inventories have been fed in the online Library Management System (LMS) till date, out of which 286 Nos. of entries have been done during the period from 1st April 2021 to 31st March 2022.

NOTES ON ACCOUNTS

1. Prasar Bharati Broadcasting Corporation of India is established as general public utility institution and falls under the category of "Not-for-Profit" Organization. Accordingly, based on Generally Accepted Accounting Practices, and Section-145 of the Income Tax Act, it can follow either cash or mercantile system of accounting. Considering the organization structure and prevalent past practices and the simplicity aspects, cash basis of accounting was being adopted upto 31.03.2005. From 01.04.2005 the accounts are initially compiled on cash basis at field unit level and subsequently converted into accrual basis to the extent possible, based on the information collected from both the Directorates. Prasar Bharati Board, however, decided to give effect to complete switch over from cash to accrual accounting at field units also. In this direction, initially, Prasar Bharati has implemented web based application called Expenditure Monitoring System (EMS) for submitting R&P Account by all field units w.e.f. 01.04.2016. Now, Prasar Bharati is in the process of implementing Centralised Accounting Application across its all field units. The software has been implemented in 20 units. The process of implementation of CAS in rest of the units of Prasar Bharati is in progress.

Bank Guarantee of ₹. 24.60 crore of M/s SIS Live was invoked and the matter was under arbitration. M/s SIS Live had submitted their claims for ₹. 106.88 crore as per contract, ₹. 24.60 crore towards BG and for damages GBP 9381,098. Out of that, an amount of ₹. 106.88 crore has been included in the liabilities. However, damages claimed by M/s SIS Live were not acknowledged as liability as the Corporation had also lodged a counter claim of ₹. 147.60 crore.

Recently, the Arbitration Tribunal in a joint award dated 27.7.2020 by two of three learned Arbitrators, have given its award directing the respondent i.e. Prasar Bharati to pay an amount of ₹. 65,10,39,562.00 in three out of five different claims made by the claimant i.e. SIS Live along with a simple interest of 9% p.a. with effect from 1.1.2011 till realization of the payment to the claimant. In the meantime, SIS live filed an execution petition in the High Court, Delhi (OM No. 33/2021) for execution of the Majority Award dated 27-07-20 to pay the Principal amount awarded together with interest by Prasar Bharati. Hon'ble High Court passed an order dated 17-05-21 and directed respondent to deposit the entire award amount along with upto date interest with the Registrar General of the Hon'ble High Court. Prasar Bharati calculated the interest and deposited a total of ₹126,33,15,516 (₹ 65,10,39,562 towards Award and ₹ 61,22,75,954 towards simple interest calculated w.e.f. 01.01.2011 to 12.06.2021 @9% per annum) in the High Court on 9-6-21. The Hon'ble High Court has passed a stay order for onward transfer of the above fund to SIS Live. M/s SIS Live has filed another case (OM No. 555/2020) in High Court, Delhi against the order. Separately, PB has also filed a petition U/s 34 of the Arbitration and Conciliation Act, 1996 (OM No. 217/2021) seeking setting aside of the award passed by the Arbitral Tribunal to the extent it passed a monetary award against PB and rejected the counter claims of PB. The matter is pending at High Court, Delhi.

3. The amount of Fixed Assets transferred at book value to Prasar Bharati by the Central Government is based on Chief Controller of Accounts' letter No. CCA/I&B/2002 dated 3.09.02 and is also subject to physical verification and valuation. The physical verification and valuation of the fixed assets is in process and not completed so far.

4. As the assets are generally disposed-off after completion of its useful life, sale proceed received from disposal of these assets is considered as profit on sale of fixed assets. The value of the assets sold/disposed of during the year has not been removed from the Gross Block of Assets as the details are not readily available at Prasar Bharati Secretariat level.

5. Grants received from Central Government are treated as Income, which together with internal revenue is utilized to meet expenses.

6. Without prejudice to rights, Prasar Bharati had paid an amount of ₹ 178,71,63,705/- to Service Tax Deptt. during the year 2011-12, in response to their demand vide order No.16/RDN/2011 dt. 05.05.2011 for the years 2003-04 to 2007-08. However, as per Management assessment, no amount was payable. In the Order dated 05.03.2018, CESTAT has completely waived off the penalty and instructed Service Tax Department to re-quantify the service tax liability for those years. The Service tax department has quantified the service tax liability and extended the Cum-Tax-Benefit vide their letter no C.No.:IV(16)Hqrs/Adj/GST-South/PB/148/2018 dated 08.01.2020. The Cum-Tax-Benefit extended by the Service Tax Department has not been accepted by Prasar Bharati. Accordingly, an Appeal had been filed before CESTAT on 23-12-2020 and the same was listed on 07-09-2021. The appeal has been registered for hearing.

Since, the whole amount was already charged off in 2011-12, hence the same will be again reflected in the Accounts after the final outcome of the case.

An appeal before CESTAT on 09-02-2021 has also been filed for the case pertaining to the FY 2008-09. The same has also been admitted in CESTAT and was listed on 14-07-2021. The direction of the Tribunal is awaited.

7. Service tax demand of ₹ 3.55 crore vide final order no.50762/2019 dated 20.05.2019 received in Prasar Bharati for the period April 2007 to September 2007. Prasar Bharati has filed the appeal in the Supreme Court. The case was listed in the Supreme Court on 21-01-2021, but the matter is yet to be listed again due to COVID issue.

8. Interest rate on Capital Loan received from Government during 01.04.2000 to 31.03.2006 was 14.5% p.a., during 1.4.2006 to 31.03.2011 was 11.5% p.a. and from 1.4.2011 onwards is 13.5% p.a. The rate of penal interest is 2.5% per annum.

9. Liability towards interest on Loan from MIB has been provided as per the interest rates mentioned at note -8 above.

10. There was a difference of ₹ 30,000/- in the books of MIB & PB in respect of capital loans outstanding against PB. The PB has reconciled the figures with MIB and noticed that it was due to the rounding of supplementary grants in crore of ₹. The PB maintained figures on actual basis but the loans figures were recorded by rounding off in crores instead of actual outstanding as on 31-03-2010. This resulted into the difference of ₹ 30,000/-. Now, PB has adjusted ₹ 30,000/- through Prior Period Adjustment account in the accounts for the financial year 2020-21.

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11. Ministry of I&B vide its letter dt. 04.06.2018 had conveyed its in-principle approval, based on the decision of the cabinet, for the conversion of the outstanding loan into Grants-in-aid pertaining to the period 2010-11 to 2012-13 and complete waiver of interest and penal interest on the above outstanding loan. However, the decision of the cabinet for the period from 1.4.2010 to 31.3.2013 is yet to be implemented by the Ministry of I & B. The details of outstanding loan, interest & penal interest thereon as on 31.03.2021 are as follows:

13. Sundry debtors are inclusive of Service Tax/GST receivable from customers.

14. The doubtful debts exist as on 01-04-2005 (i.e. at the time of change of method of accounting from cash basis to accrual basis) against which legal action had already been initiated for recovery were not reflected in accounts as the extent of doubtfulness is not ascertainable. These debts are accounted for when their collection become certain.

15. There are 74 number of arbitration cases pending as on 31-3-2021 and amount involved is ₹ 327,70,34,860.

16. Keeping in view of uncertainty of collection, Interest on delayed payment is recognized in books of accounts on receipt basis from the financial year 2018-19.

17. Prasar Bharati is exempt from Income Tax as per Clause 23BBH under Section-10 of Income Tax Act.

18. Prasar Bharati's contribution towards Leave Salary and Pension in respect of employees on deemed deputation is charged as expenditure.

19. Audit fee payable to C&AG for auditing Prasar Bharati's Accounts for the year 2020-21 has been provided for ₹ 7,50,000.

20. Provision for Spectrum & Space Segment charges have been provided on estimation basis.

21. Interest on Fixed deposit and flexi deposits of Field offices and on Advances to staff are accounted for as and when received. The quantum of accrued interest cannot be computed due to flexible tenure and interest rates on CLTD accounts and advances.

22. The payment and recovery of non-interest bearing short term advances to employees are adjusted from Establishment expenditure.

23. Capital Work-in-progress amounting to ₹ 00 crore has been capitalized during the year 2020-21.

24. Provision of ₹ 16.02 crore and ₹ 12.49 crore in respect of "Other Departmental Loans/Advances" and "Inventories" respectively under Current Assets had been provided during the year 2014-15 as item/ party wise details of these are not available and the amount was being carried forward.

25. Provision for contribution towards NPS and interest thereon as on 31.03.2021 is ₹ 2.58 crores. This provision represents the Employee and Employer's contribution and interest thereon which has not yet been transferred to National Securities Depository Ltd. (NSDL) though the amount has been kept in separate bank Account. Out of this, ₹ 1.75 crore have been transferred to NSDL up to 6.09.2021 and efforts are being made to transfer the remaining amount involved in all legacy cases to NSDL in due course.

26. The provision for Leave Encashment and gratuity payable to employees recruited by Prasar Bharati on or after 05.10.2007 have been provided for in the books of accounts on the basis of actuarial valuation reports. The liabilities have been calculated as per 'CCS Pension Rules 1972'. The details of provision made up to the financial year 2020-21 is as follows:

27. The payment instruments amounting to ₹ 95,97,410 received for hiring of slot over DTH platform during the year 2013-14 were not actually realized due to fraudulent instruments. The matter is subjudice. The same has been accounted for as prior period income and provision equivalent to full amount has been made during the year 2018-19.

28. The unspent amount of Grants-in-aid payable to the Ministry has been shown separately as current liabilities.

29. As per the advice of CAG, the amount received for specific purpose has been shown separately in Schedule 3 as earmarked fund.

30. In Receipts & Payments Accounts, the revenue share paid to other agencies has been shown under 'Programme Expenses'.

31. Amount of advance received against deposit work has been revised due to the reconciliation of the Remittance Heads.

32. The amount receivable as Grants-in-aid salary has been shown separately as current assets.
